LONDON, Dec. 10.—After considering throughout a three-hour session at Downing Street this afternoon the German note which was presented at the British Foreign Office last night, and which contains the proposal for an international loan of 5,000,000,000 gold marks to Germany, the conference of Allied premiers, which is meeting here, faces tonight a situation that is acutely felt in its bearing on the whole future of Europe.

Wizard Evans Denies Fight on Religion, but Warns of Rome's Encroachment in America

DALLAS, Tex., Dec. 10.—Characterizing the Catholics, Jews, negroes and foreigners as the chief enemies of the Knights of the Ku-Klux Klan, an organization which, notwithstanding its lofty principles, has been subjected to the most violent and protracted attack in the history of the American Republic from every alien and un-American element on the American soil, Dr. H. W. Evans, now Imperial wizard of the Klan, in his first public statement since being elected to that position, to-day proclaimed the principles of the organization and discussed the purposes, activities, growth and ultimate aims of the fraternity.

Irish Rebels Bomb and Burn Homes of Free State Officials in Dublin

DUBLIN, Dec. 10 (By The Associated Press).—The opponents of the Irish government resumed their reprisals against Free State officials to-night. Attacks with bombs and gasoline were made on the residence of J. J. Walsh, Postmaster General, and others identified with the government. The Walsh residence, which is in Frederick Street, was not badly damaged, and the promptness of the firemen and neighbors in each case prevented the fires spreading.
