**Arts and Sciences.**

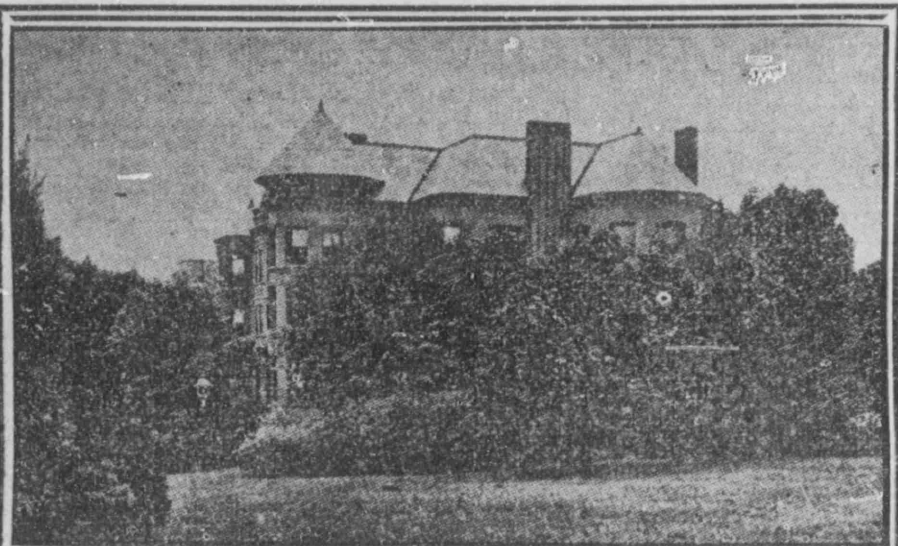
