REAL ESTATE MARKET
Large Lot Held at \$375,000 Sold
Eleven Story Structure in West 24th Street Near Fifth Avenue Recently Acquired by Sellers in a Trade.

DEAL IN BRONX PROPERTIES INVOLVES \$150,000

Axelrad & Feinberg, Inc., have sold for the Wilmore Realty Company the eleven story building at Nos. 13 and 15 West 24th street, occupying a plot 228x89 feet, located 296 feet west of Fifth avenue and being diagonally opposite the Fifth Avenue Building. The property was held at \$375,000, and was acquired by the sellers about eighteen months ago from the Brunswick Realty Company, which secured the building in a trade for the office building at No. 18 East 25th street. The structure was erected in 1906 by Andrew J. Kerwin from plans by Frederick C. Zobel.

Arthur West & Co., sold for the Winnie Company, Maurice Müller, president of the company, building north in the course of construction on the north side of Westchester avenue, 30 feet east of Elder avenue, a plot of 490 feet, also for the same company a plot on the north side of Wheeler avenue 190 feet west of Westchester avenue. The buyer, Samuel Winters, an investor, gave in part payment the plot 135x160 feet at the southeast corner of Palisade place and Undercliff avenue, which will be improved by the Winnie company with two high class dwelling houses. The building sold contains seven large stores, including a bakery and also a moving picture and outdoor theatre seating 1,500 people. The transaction involves \$150,000.

SELLER OF GREEN COURT

The Lawyers Title Insurance and Trust Corporation, dissolved, is the seller of a six-story apartment at No. 180 to 182 Seventh avenue, the sale of which to A. M. Bendheim was announced last week. The building, which contains six lots at the southwest corner of St. Nicholas avenue and 180th street were given to the corporation by the Lawyers Title Insurance Co. in 1910.

ELEVATOR FOR JUDGES

Plans have been filed with Building Superintendent Miller by Julian H. Healy, Superintendent of the courts, for the installation of an elevator in the old county courthouse, on the south side of Chambers street, 145 feet east of Broadway. The elevator will be erected in the portion of the building recently used as the justices' private chambers, and is to be used exclusively by the justices. The cost has been estimated at \$25,000.
