FRENCH ANTICIPATE NEW COUNTER DRIVE Greater Struggle to Come When Storming of Second Trench Line Is Attempted.

Paris, Sept. 28.—Intelligence from the Champagne front beyond Chalons which reached Paris to-day shows that it was the right of the German Crown Prince's army which was shattered in the attacks of Friday and Saturday.

Renewed Assault Three Times. In yesterday's attack the Germans sent two divisions against the French lines after a preparatory bombardment. The artillery fire did not demoralize the French line, which held every foot of ground.

Crown Prince's Attack Checked. In the Argonne the eighth attack delivered yesterday by the enemy with six or eight battalions against our first line trenches at La Fille Morte and at Nolance resulted in a serious check.

BRITISH ADVANCE IN HAZE OF GUNS Yesterday's fighting was brilliant and successful, with a cloudless blue sky, good for artillery observation.

Water Red with German Blood. All day there was a heavy rain, which made the trenches and the fields wet and boggy, and our soldiers, digging themselves into the ground they gained, were clogged with mud and sodden with water red with German blood.

Great Battle Is Resumed. To-day the battle was resumed. The British are advancing in an immensely concentrated line between La Bassée and Lens, with the French on our right working upward from the captured town of Souches.

New Helms Saved Many. All of the wounded who have arrived here were covered from head to foot with chalk mud. Most of them were wearing the new light steel helmets, which they declared had saved thousands of lives.

GERMAN BANK TO THWART LOANS

National Institution Planned to Counteract Allies' Influence. Impetus for launching a German-American National Bank was given last night by several thousand German-Americans and their sympathizers at a mass meeting in the Amsterdam Opera House.

Jeremiah O'Leary, president of the American Truth Society, threw a bomb into the meeting by announcing that he made it would be just as disastrous. R. S. McCann, editor of "Waterways and Commerce," a monthly magazine, acted as chairman and opened the meeting with a brief outline of its object.
