MILK SUBMARINE FOR RELIEF AHOY!

Undersea Craft to Save European Babies Feasible, Says Committee.

FRANCE'S EMBARGO GIVES BIRTH TO IDEA

Vessel Would Carry No War Equipment; Just Dive to Avoid Detention.

Picture a submarine loaded with condensed milk scooting along underneath the troubled, war-torn surface of the Atlantic, taking food to the starving babies in Germany, Austria-Hungary and Russian Poland.
