TRY CHAUFFEUR AS SLAYER Prosecution Handicapped by Brain Injury of Child's Nurse.

Carl M. Emmerich, the chauffeur who ran down the niece of Judge Charles C. Nett, jr., of General Sessions, killing one of them and seriously injuring the other and their nursemaid, was placed on trial yesterday before Justice Weeks and a jury in the Supreme Court for manslaughter. The prosecution of Emmerich will be seriously handicapped, because the nurse, Elizabeth Becker, suffering from an apparently irremediable loss of memory as to what happened.

JEROME AVENUE SUBWAY RELIEF Craven Says Line Can Be Operated as Far as 149th Street Late in Summer.

Alfred Craven, chief engineer of the Public Service Commission, submitted his report to that body yesterday on the proposed temporary operation of the Jerome Avenue and Lexington Avenue subway lines prior to the completion of the diagonal connection at Forty-second Street. He said that the operation of the Jerome Avenue line as far south as 149th Street would be possible by the end of the summer.
