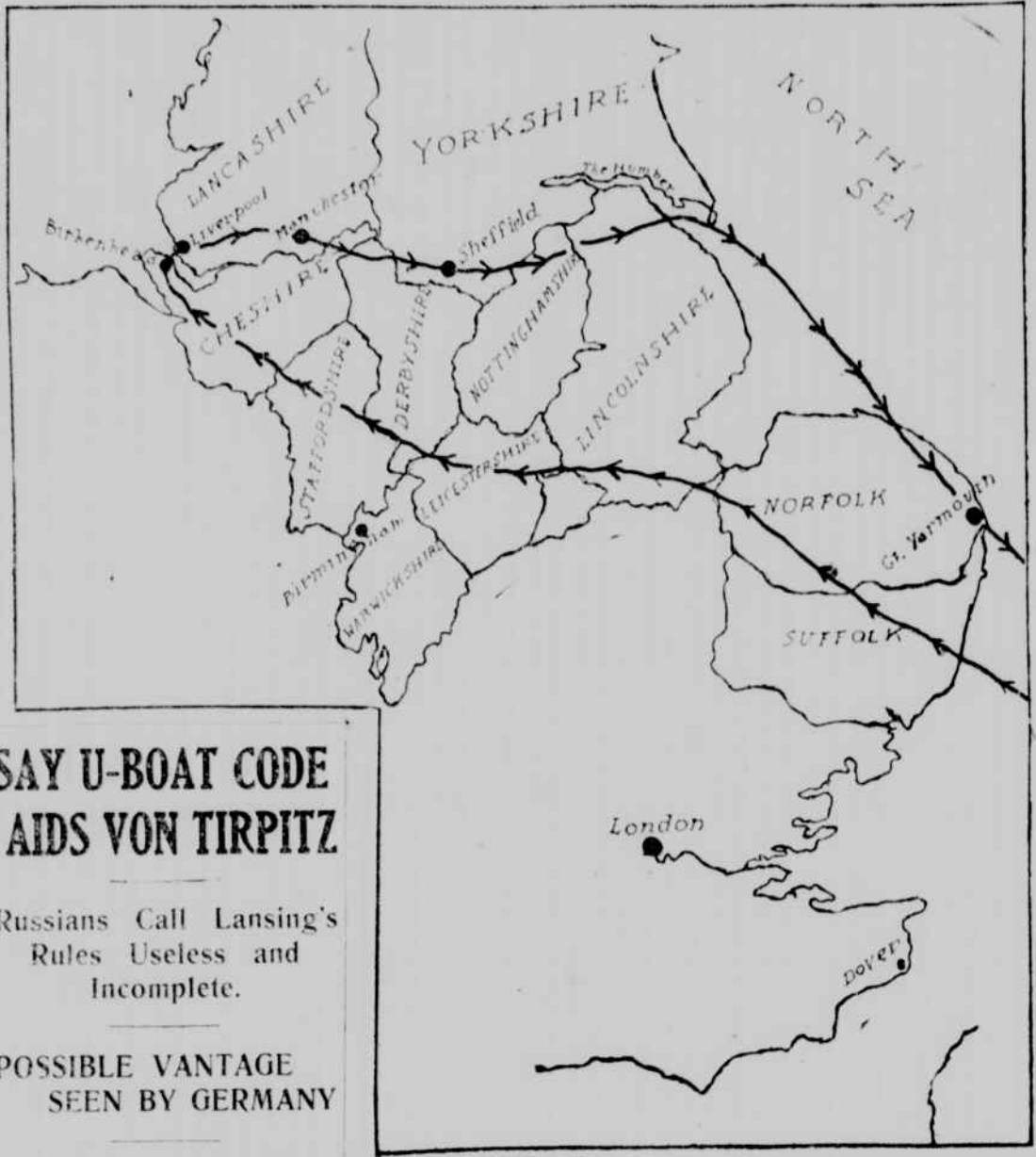

BRITAIN DENIES DESIRE FOR SEPARATE PEACE
