

# ACQUIT KAPLAN IN PRISON CASE

Jury Out Five Hours—Verdict Hailed as Victory for Osborne.

## IMMORALITY CHARGE CALLED FRAME-UP

Trial of Warden Adjourned from February 14 to 21, After Tilt Over Evidence.

Another decided victory was won by Warden Thomas Mott Osborne last night, when, after five hours' deliberation, the jury that tried Nathan Kaplan, a Sing Sing convict, on a charge of immorality, exonerated him. Throughout the trial it had been charged by the defense that Kaplan was the victim of a conspiracy to convict him and thus deprive Warden Osborne.

Kaplan's lawyer repeatedly charged that William Willett, jr., had "framed up" the evidence that was produced at the hearing.

John Matthews, an eighteen-year-old prisoner from Blackwell's Island, testified that he saw Kaplan and Willett talking, his evidence being presented by the defense to show that Willett was behind the conspiracy to get former Warden Osborne through Kaplan.

Another attorney who testified that he had heard Willett tell Kaplan in White Plains that he could go to the jail to frame up Osborne, and that Kaplan replied that he would tell the truth.

Kaplan testified that because he refused to stand for a conspiracy against his brother, he was transferred to Clinton prison, a regular "bitch."

Louis Brandeis, recently nominated by President Wilson for the Supreme Court, has resigned from the board of arbitrators for the waist and dress makers.

With Judge Mack as their new chairman, the board of arbitration will meet on all day yesterday, discussing terms which would settle the pending strike of 40,000 shirtwaist makers.

Barren Island Dump Favorite Haunt of Trappers, Says Dr. Roos.

## ANTHRAX GERMS FIND HOME IN THE SKINS

Whiskers of Billy Goats, Also Bacilli Carriers, Used in Shaving Brushes.

Furs for babies are being made from the skins of cats long dead picked out of the rubbish at the dumping grounds of Barren Island.

Within these furs and shaving brushes lurk the deadly anthrax bacilli, waiting an opportunity to enter a living body through an abrasion.

Dr. Leslie I. Roos, of the State Department of Labor, suggested this source of anthrax infection November 18, the day Sophia Rosen, seventeen years old, died from anthrax in Bellevue Hospital.

Through Dr. C. T. Graham Rogers, Chief of the Division of Industrial Hygiene, Dr. Roos will submit within the next ten days a report to the State Industrial Commission.
