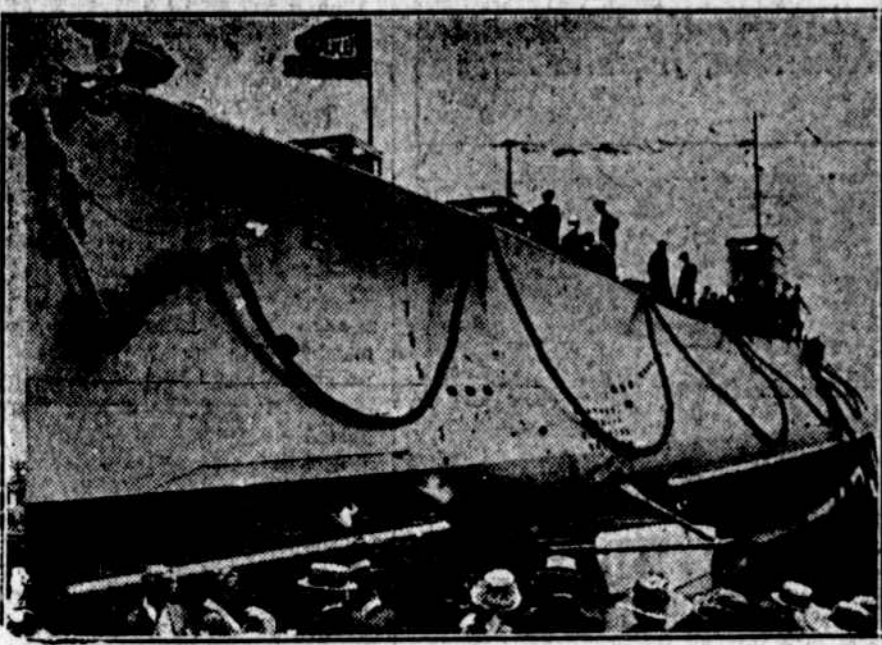


Latest "Sub" Launched

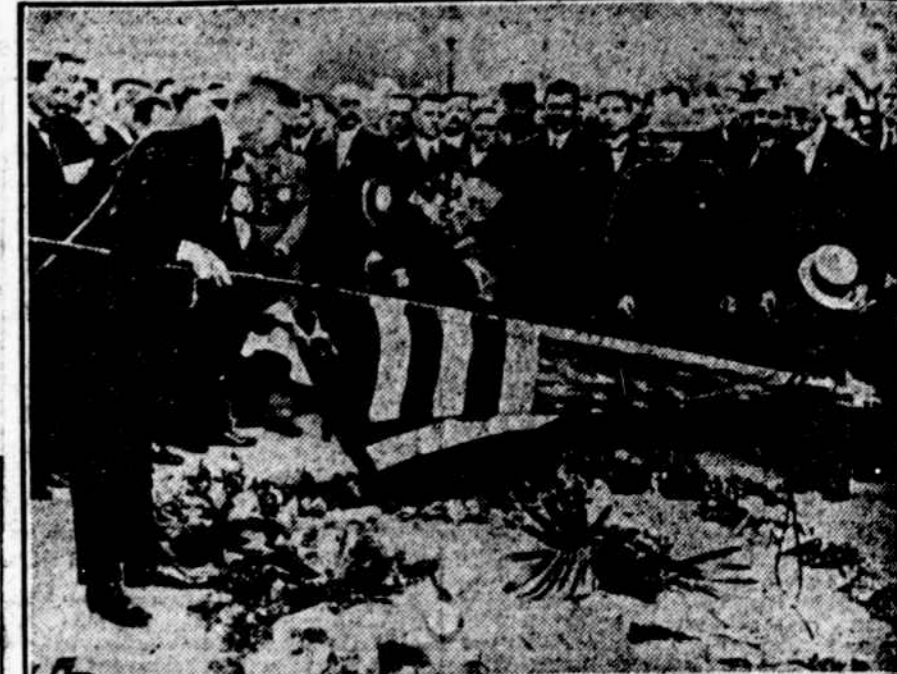

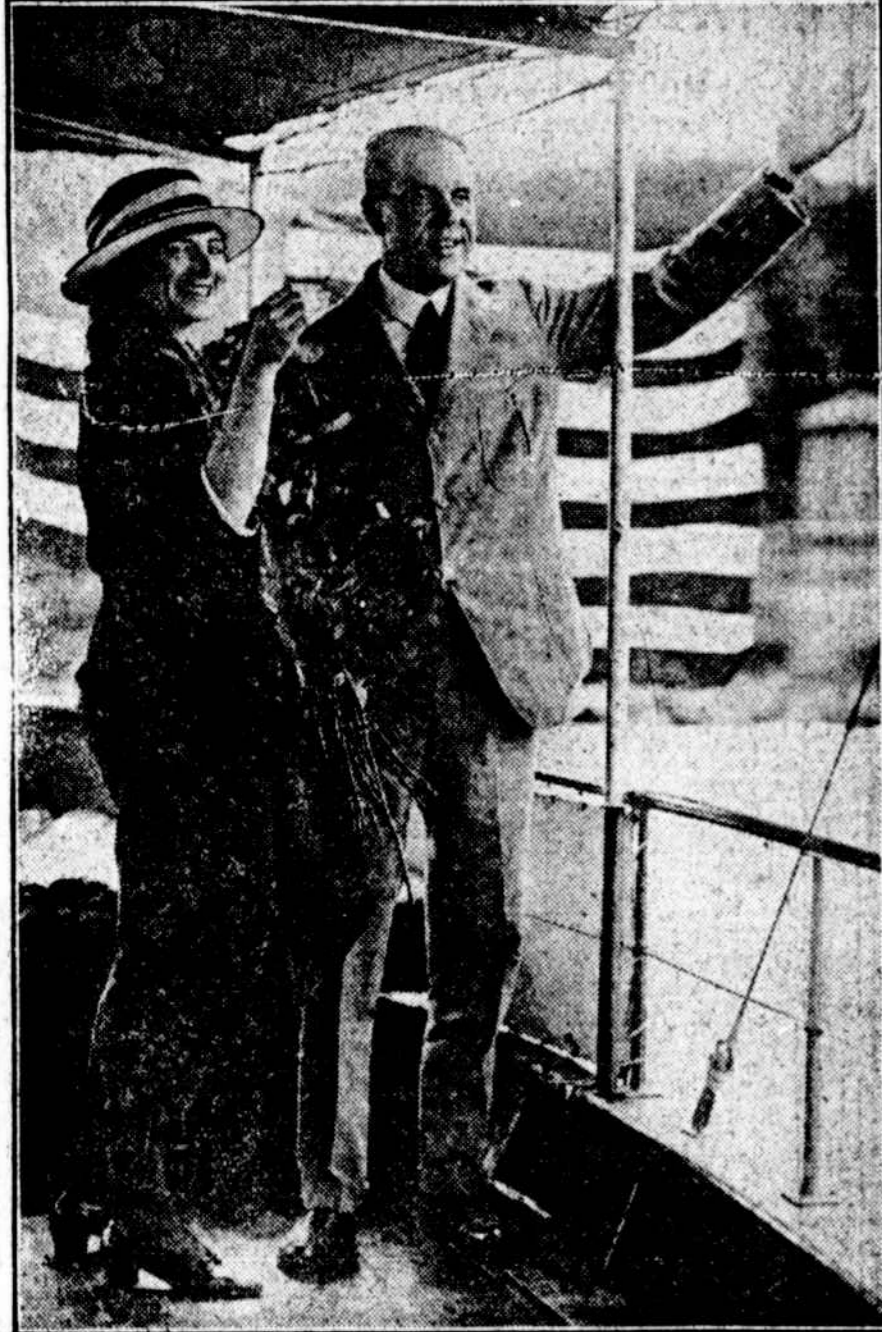
Madalynne Faces Judge

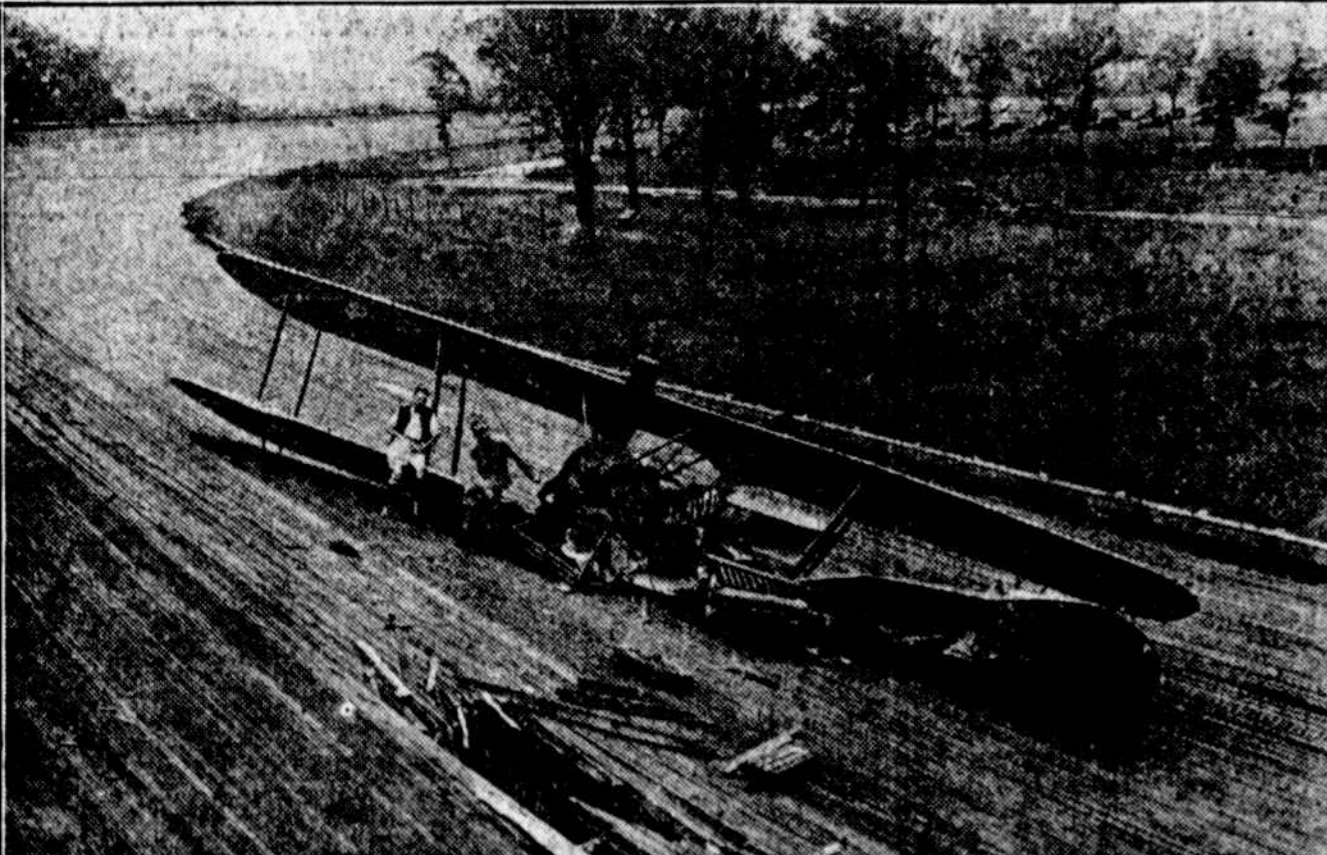

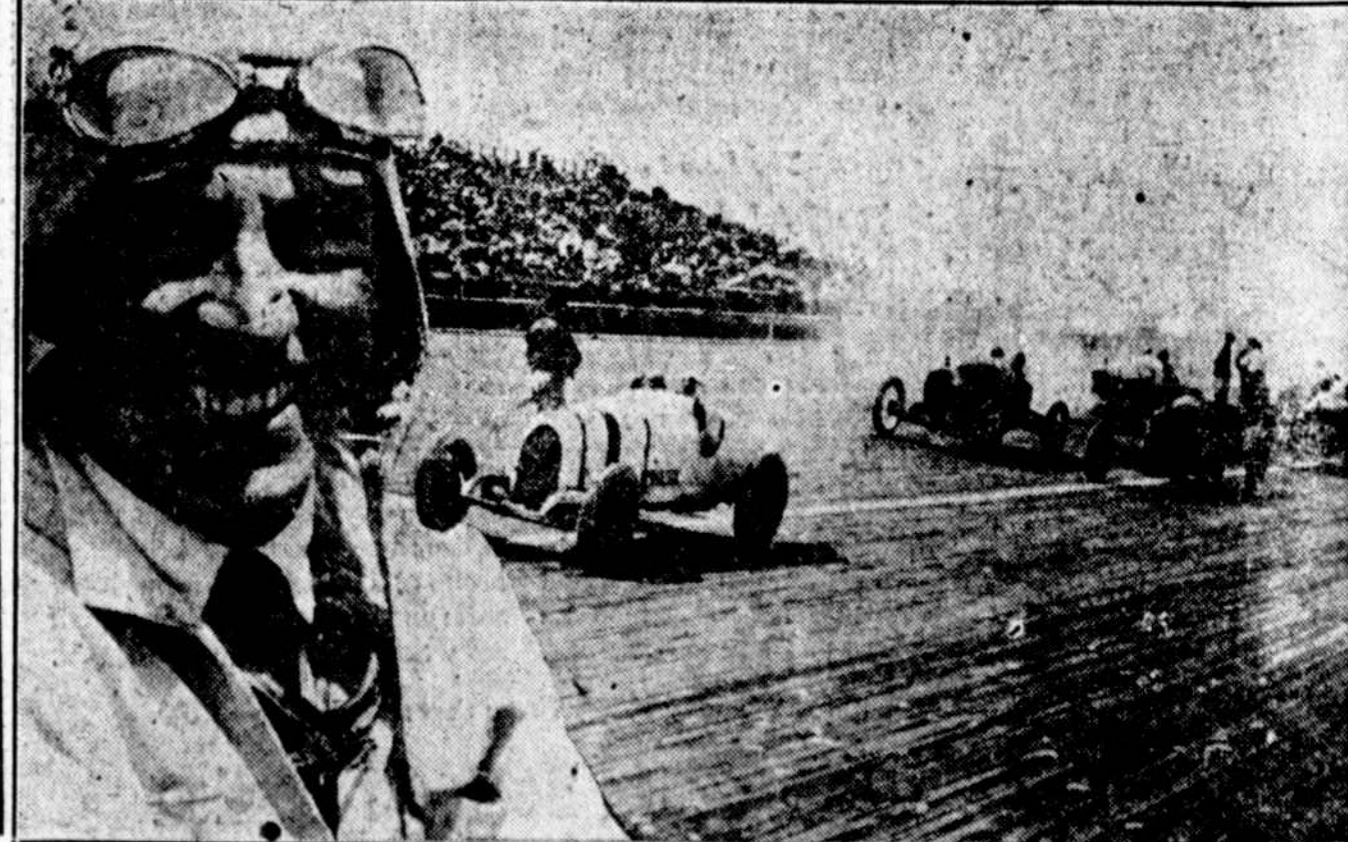
