## ENTHUSIASTIC SESSION ENDED BY BAPTISTS

A memorable session of the Pensacola Bay Baptist association was brought to a close Sunday at East Hill Baptist church with the ordination of Rev. A. A. Wainwright to the full work of the Gospel ministry. Letters from the churches indicate perhaps the most successful year in the history of the association. A spirit of optimism and confidence in the future pervaded the body.

Especially significant was the reception of the report of the committee on apportionment for the seventy-five million campaign. This committee was asked to raise \$40,000. The committee on which every church was represented, made an apportionment totalling \$53,350. The report of the committee was adopted by an enthusiastic vote, and now goes to the churches for their ratification.

Several churches have already adopted the amounts requested by the committee, and some others did so yesterday. Two of the weaker churches have even voted to raise a larger amount than asked for. The feeling of enthusiasm for this campaign was indicated recently by one of the rural churches whose pastor had expressed himself as not being in sympathy with the movement. When his term expired, the church declined to call him for another year, preferring to be without a pastor, having one out of sympathy with a cause that lies so near the hearts of the Baptist people.

## BUCKEY COACH LECTURES TO STOP BONERS

Coach Wilce, in charge of the football team of Ohio State University, is not taking any chances on his gridders pulling a "bonehead" play in the conference games this season. Wilce has adopted a schedule of gridiron lectures and blackboard drills for the members of his squad and every man on the varsity will be obliged to pass a quiz in the fundamentals of the sport before he will be permitted to take part in the big contests on the Buckeye schedule.

The plan of the Ohio State mentor is not entirely original, but he has revamped it somewhat. The American coach probably most responsible for this system of instruction is Glen Warner at the University of Pittsburgh, who got into the habit of dishing out hints on the rudiments of the game when he was in charge of the foot ball affairs at the Carlisle Indian School. Warner still holds tenaciously to the idea of having every griddier know what not to do as well as what to do, but it remained for Coach Wilce to give regular instructions with quizzes.

When football practice was called for at Ohio State, Coach Wilce lectured on the recent rule changes. He devoted some time to open discussion, and it was at this time he learned how little some of his timber knew about the finer points of the pastime.

The hint was sufficient and the next day he appeared before the body with a regular lecture on the rudiments, followed by a quiz from which some of the older heads declared they had learned a few new wrinkles. Wilce is a hard taskmaster when it comes to football, and he is also one of the very few coaches in this country with whom no even the most daring athletes will take many chances. He expects his charges to make mistakes but the charge hears about it in an unmistakable tone and language if he makes the same blunder twice. After all it is as important to know the rules as it is to have the courage to play. Wilce is out after the Western Conference football championship again this year and he is leaving nothing undone to accomplish his purpose. "Chick" Harley will again be the star of the Buckeye eleven.

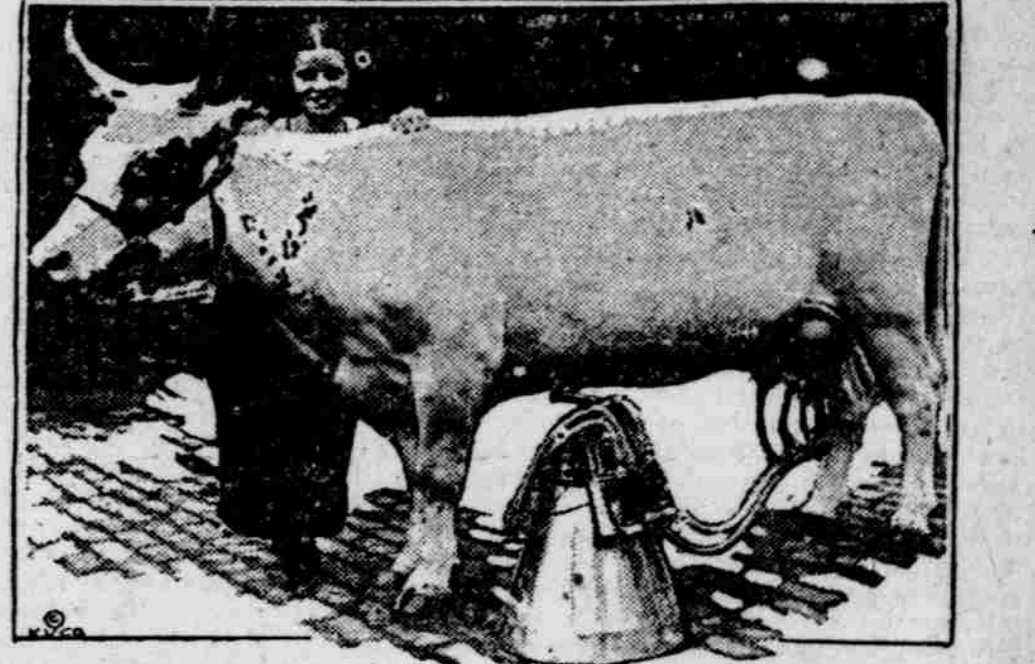
