OVER MILLION BRITISH TROOPS NOW IN FRANCE; MANY OFFICERS KILLED

PARIS, MARCH 17.--HEAVY CASUALTIES AMONG THE BRITISH OFFICERS WAS A FEATURE OF THE TERRIFIC FOUR-DAYS' BATTLE AT NEUVE CHAPPELLE, WHERE THE GERMANS WERE DEFEATED AND FORCED TO RETREAT FOUR MILES. THE BRITISH LOSSES ARE ESTIMATED AT 10,000 MEN, KILLED, WOUNDED OR MISSING. THIS NUMBER WERE OVER 200 OFFICERS.

ENGLAND NOW HAS THE LARGEST ARMY IN FRANCE THAT EVER BEEN PLACED ON FOREIGN SOIL. THE BRITISH FORCES THIS COUNTRY NOW NUMBER OVER A MILLION MEN. MANY OF THESE HAVE NOT YET BEEN SENT TO THE FIRING LINE.

Cathedral's Vicissitudes.
St. Paul's cathedral of London has had a strange association with fire. The first edifice on the present site was erected in 610 by Ethelbert, king of Kent, but in 1087 this was destroyed by fire. Finally in 1666, when the great fire devastated most of London, St. Paul's was wrecked, this being the fifth fire. In 1675 the present church was built by Charles II at a cost of more than \$7,500,000.
