WORLD'S FAIR AT TAMPA

Washington, Oct. 3.—The Bureau of Economic and Labor has issued a bulletin on the foreign commerce of Cuba, showing that it aggregated over \$100,000,000 per annum, the principal figures being given as follows: Imports, \$25,000,000 and exports \$115,000,000.

Of the imports \$5 per cent were in 1905 drawn from the United States, and of the exports \$5 per cent were sent to the United States. It is stated that there has been a steady gain in the share of the imports drawn from this country, while the share of exports sent to the United States in 1905 was \$4 per cent.

Of the exports sugar alone amounted to \$63,000,000; tobacco crude and manufactured, \$27,000,000 and fruits about \$1,000,000. Of the imports, cotton manufactures were in round terms \$9,000,000; breadstuffs, including rice, \$9,000,000; woolen \$7,000,000; meats, \$7,000,000; machinery, \$5,000,000; manufacturing of iron and steel, not classed as machinery, about \$4,000,000; leather and manufactures thereof, \$3,500,000; and wines, malt, liquors and spirits and other beverages, about \$2,000,000.

Cuba's Political Situation

Washington, Oct. 3.—Cuba is face to face with a very serious situation. If the liberal party representing the revolutionaries should be successful in the general elections which it is proposed to hold it will mean negro domination in the island—the very thing the best people of the island have been trying to avert since a Republic was created in Cuba.

Cuba's Disarmament Campaign

Havana, Oct. 3.—The cruiser Brooklyn yesterday landed three hundred and fifty marines, who went in to camp in Cienfuegos. The battleships Kentucky and Indiana will sail from here at once for New England waters. No further reports of trouble in any part of the island have been received. The disarmament of the insurgents is practically complete, with the exception of small isolated bands, who will be dispersed by the coast guards.
