WORK FOR THE BOARD OF TRADE.

Tallahassee has a Board of Trade.

I make this statement because I have placards
stating such facts.

Accepting that as proof of the existence of the Board
of Trade, the belief naturally follows that it is organized
for the benefit of Tallahassee.

Matters tending to the industrial welfare of the city,
no doubt, come within its province, therefore the sug-
gestion I am about to make will furnish this same Board
of Trade reason for action.

Action that will result in good to the city and will
strengthen its claims to continuance as the Capital of
the State.

Here is the suggestion:

Let the Board of Trade seek out available sites for the
annex to the Capitol building, as proposed in a bill re-
cently introduced in the Legislature.

Get prices on these sites, so that definite information
can be given the Legislature.

It is proper work for the Board of Trade to do, because
it is equipped for such purpose.

Having the best interests of the city at heart, it can
do this thing in satisfactory manner—in a way that
should be acceptable to the Legislature.

As a Board of Trade, it could best arrange for securing
an available site at a proper value.

While the State is well able to pay for what it may
need, yet it should be the duty of the Board of Trade of
this city to see that an excessive price is not placed on
whatever ground may be selected for the proposed annex.

This is work that the Board of Trade can and should
do—

And—

Do it at once.

While on this subject of land for the use of State build-
ings I am reminded of the surroundings of the Governor's
mansion.

This was a case wherein the State was negligent in its
dealing.

Instead of buying land sufficient for the location of the
mansion the matter was left to citizens of Tallahassee to
provide a site.

This was done, but there was no reason why the State
should have placed itself in the attitude of a beggar.

As I have said, the State is well able to pay for its
needs, and a plot of ground on which to put the Gov-
ernor's mansion should have been one of its purchases.

That, however, is now with the past.
A present necessity, though, may be considered—that
of acquiring more land about the mansion, that a park
worthy of the home of the Governor of Florida may
surround the structure now nearly completed.

POORLY PAID—PAY PROPERLY.

Increase in the salary of the officials of the State is
perfectly compatible with the resources of Florida. The
State is rich enough to pay the trusted servants at the
head of her government salaries commensurate with the
work they accomplish and the exactions made of them.

A bill has been introduced increasing salaries to
\$3,500. This bill has been amended that the salaries be
made \$3,000.

A GOOD BILL but a POOR AMENDMENT.

Good for the reason that as the State of Florida is
entitled to the best service, it should pay for same. Poor
for the reason that receiving excellent service the \$3,000
salary is not the equivalent for the goods received. We
must not go on record as not paying our officials enough.
We must come up to the mark, and give the men who
devote their time, energy and effort for the welfare of
the State, the same salaries they would receive for similar
demands made of them in highly responsible and com-
manding positions in commercial life.

When the bill is brought up on its second reading
there should be no delay to offer an amendment which
will put the salaries of these officials to at least \$3,500.
There is nothing else to do but that, and that is but little
enough.

The bill making the salary of the Attorney General
\$3,500 is a good bill, but it does not adequately repre-
sent the pay this important official should receive, when
it is taken into consideration that corporations pay their
lawyers as high as \$10,000 to look after their interests.
And they, individually, have more than one. They have
several. The legal business of the State devolves upon
one man, and as his duties are numerous and heavy, his
\$3,500 salary does not represent his worth.

Let there be an amendment to provide sufficiently and
worthily for these men for the returns they give the
State in the amount of work, responsibility, care and
efficiency which they assume and render Florida.
