VARIETY.

Switzerland sustains 345 newspapers.
The Richmond housewives are glad to get flour at one hundred dollars per barrel!
Chickens are five dollars each in Richmond.
The pensions already allowed amount to twelve millions per annum.
It is suggested that Gen. Hardee secured his wife by his "tactics."
The capital extended at Washington, up to this time, has cost \$6,389,000.
Ohio makes 8,280,000 pounds of sugar from sorghum.
The Richmond Whig confirms the statement of 3,000,000 bales of cotton in the Confederacy.
The President of one insurance company in New York receives a salary of \$20,000 per annum.
A great revolution is in progress in New Hampshire, and the churches cannot hold the people who are flocking to them.
The claims for pensions already filed by widows and mothers, exceed one hundred and fifty thousand.
The breaches in rebel fortifications are designed for the last legs of the Southern Confederacy.
The last return of the Bank of France showed that it had lost 41,765,000 in bullion during the month.
There is said to be between \$120,000,000 and \$140,000,000 of rebel counterfeited money in circulation.
Capt. Westervelt who piloted General Burnside's expedition to Newbern, was among those captured on the gunboat Underwriter. The rebels had offered \$1,000 for him, dead or alive, and when captured he was bound hands and feet.

The other evening he gave a brilliant reception, the expenses of the single evening being, it is said, considerably more than his salary as a Congressman for a year. Literally late in the evening, the Marine Band struck up "Old John Brown's Soul is Marching on." Was ever stranger sound heard in or out of Washington? Old John Brown in the parlors of Washington!
Assessors or Franklin—A young person once mentioned to Dr. Franklin his surprise that the possession of riches should be attended with undue solicitude, and instanced a merchant, who, in possession of unbounded wealth, was as busy, and much more anxious, than the most industrious clerk in his counting-house. The Doctor, in reply, took an apple from a basket, and presented it to a child in the room, who could hardly grasp it in his hand. He then gave him a second, which filled the other; and choosing a third, remarkable for its size, he offered that also. The child after many ineffectual attempts to hold the three apples, dropped the last, and burst into tears. "See," said the Doctor, "there is a little man with more riches than he can enjoy."
To Divide an Apple without Dividing the Peel on Kinds—Take a fine needle and thread. Pass the needle under the rind of the apple, doing about an inch at a time, and putting in the needle at the same hole it came out at each time, until the thread is under the rind of the apple all round. Take both ends of the thread in the hand and draw both gradually, which will divide the apple (unless very hard) into two parts, without separating the rind. An apple may thus be divided into several parts, in the same manner, while the rind remains entire.
The Ring Suspended by a Rust Thread—Put a teaspoonful of salt into a wine-glass of water; stir it up, and place in it some coarse cotton; in about an hour take out the thread and dry it. The piece of this prepared thread to a small ring hold it up and set fire to the thread; when it has burnt out, the ring will not fall but remain suspended, to the astonishment of all beholders. This is accounted for by the fact that the salt in the thread forms, with the ashes of the cotton, a fine film of glass which is strong enough to support the ring, or any small weight.
