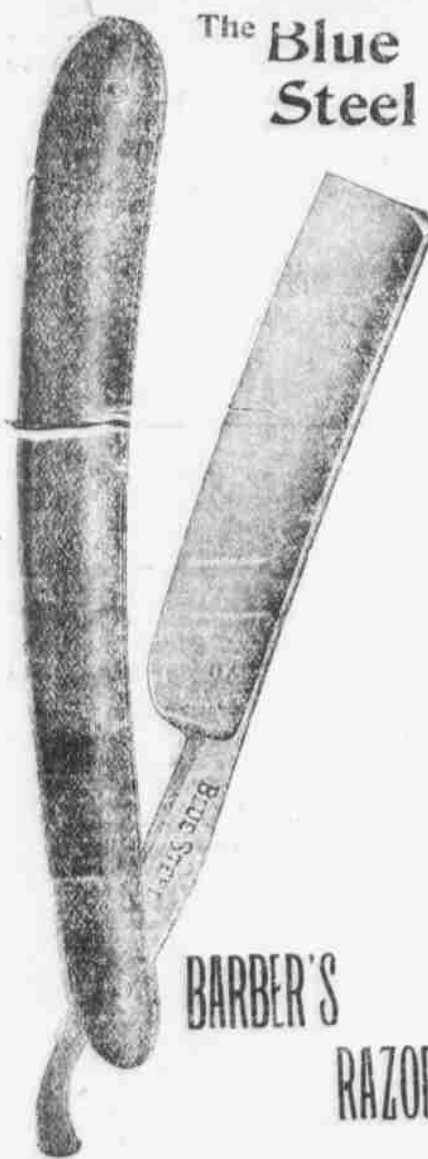

IS ILLEGAL IN PARTS

APPROPRIATION FOR THE FIRE CLAIMS.

Commissioners Have Three Thousand Seven Hundred Decisions Ready. Only a Million Dollars Appropriated.

The Chinatown Fire Commissioners have made decisions in about 3,700 of the six thousand and odd cases submitted to them. The decisions are being held for the present, and probably none will be made public until the end of the court's work.

The commissioners are nearing the end of their public hearings now. It is thought that they will finish taking testimony this month. Then they will continue constantly in executive session, adjudicating the claims they have heard. With some of the claims this will be a slow process, as there is a lot of testimony.

The court is practically through with the claims for personal property. These were the easiest to settle, and they were tackled first. The 3,700 decisions now held by the clerk are personal property decisions. When it comes to real property and merchandise, the court is compelled to work much more slowly. Merchandise claims especially require much time and examination of testimony.

There is no doubt that the decisions are going to be a disappointment to a large number of claimants, and that there will be a big howl when the judgments are rendered. It is reported that the claims for personal property, which constituted a majority of all the claims presented, have been heavily cut. In most cases the claims were based on cost prices of goods some years old, and the commissioners would not stand for these valuations.

It is estimated that there is two or three months' work ahead before the claims will have been all decided. The present prospect is that no claims will be paid before the end of that time. When the decisions come, the warrants under the act under which the commissioners are proceeding, will be for one-third of each claim provided the total of the claims amounts to \$1,500,000 or over. In setting aside that sum the legislature provided that it should be paid out of the treasury at the rate of \$500,000 per year for the next three years; the yearly sum to be apportioned pro rata among those having claims.

One-third of the appropriation is held to be unconstitutional, and will probably never be paid out of the treasury. It is the \$500,000 for the third year. Auditor Austin is inclined to think that the legislature exceeded its powers in making appropriations for more than the regular fiscal period of two years, and that the attempt to set aside money for a future fiscal period is ineffectual. This will mean another appropriation by the next legislature, if the money is needed, and makes the total sum so far set aside to pay claims only \$1,500,000.

ST. CLEMENT'S FAIR.

Preparations for the St. Clement's bazaar to be held tomorrow afternoon and evening are going on rapidly this afternoon. The Rectory grounds at the corner of Wilder avenue and Makiki street are assuming a very gay appearance. Lines of flags and streamers encircle the grounds. The American and Hawaiian flags predominate in this display of color and bunting but the flags of many other nations are also hung to the breeze.

On the lawn are a number of marquees of vari-colored canvas, which will be used as booths. Near the spacious lanai of the Rectory are other marquees and booths, and everything indicates a most attractive affair.
