**DAVID CARTER SUICIDES.**  
Shoots Himself With Pistol And Is Dead.

David Carter, a cousin of Governor Carter and a young man well known about town, shot and killed himself early yesterday morning. Family and business troubles, aided by the effects of a spree which had been kept up for a week, were the causes. The deceased used a 38-caliber revolver to effect his purpose, firing a ball into the left temple. Death ensued within a few minutes. The funeral will take place from H. H. Williams, undertaking parlor at 4 o'clock this afternoon. Interment in Pauoa cemetery.

Early yesterday morning Carter arose and, with pistol in hand, told his wife he was going to shoot himself. He hurriedly left the house and proceeded to the edge of a neighboring rice field where the deed was committed. Mrs. Carter had, in the meanwhile, notified and appealed to Captain Kane, who is a neighbor. The police officer had scarcely left his own house to follow the desperate man when he heard the shot and presently came to the almost lifeless body.

Deceased's father was a brother of the late H. A. P. Carter, father of Governor Carter. Some years ago he was on the mounted patrol, since when he has worked in different saloons. He left a wife and three children, all of the latter being quite young.
