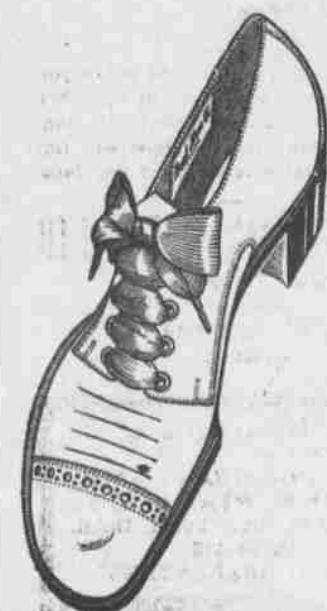

DEFINITE PLANS TO EXTEND SERVICE

(Continued from Page One.)

Yard, where it was announced that unless the character of the town in the vicinity of the reservation was cleaned up, and very well cleaned up, the work at that point would be stopped entirely.

As the result of this agreement the merchants of this city will reap a great deal more benefit than has even been expected for the men working in the construction of the great docks and the many large buildings which will be constructed as barracks and storehouses, will all live in this city. The new line to be built by the Rapid Transit Company will furnish a means of transportation which will be both cheap and convenient.

In speaking of the service which would be given Superintendent Ballentyne said:

"It is too early to say definitely just what will be done in this regard but we will probably give a half hourly service, possibly one which will mean a car every twenty minutes. That is something which must be worked out later. We will have a high speed line and use the finest of rolling stock, getting four-motor cars for the purpose. Since our right of way will run entirely through private property from the time we leave King street until we enter the Naval Reservation and not even cross public thoroughfares, we will be able to give a far better service than if we were running on a public street.

"The preliminary line of survey as it has been laid out will not take the line past Fort Shafter. If it is decided that we should run past the present post, it will be accomplished as an addition to the present King street line. We have made no definite plans in this regard.

"The Pearl Harbor line, as now surveyed, will leave King street very near the end of the present line and skirt the bluff on which the Fort Shafter hospital is located, turning makai. It will come close to the tracks of the Oahu Railroad and Land Company at about the point where the private road running from Moanalua over to Damon

island crosses that line. From that point we will parallel the railroad them in such a manner that very little tracks, still keeping on the mauka side for about 2600 feet. This is all low land which will have to be filled in.

"The material for this fill will be obtained from the cut which we will make through the bluff on the other side. The grade will commence quite far back and be a very slight one. We will go straight through the bluff in this manner till we reach the top, where there will be a most magnificent view. From this point one can look back and see all Honolulu and Honolulu Harbor, while in the other direction Pearl Harbor spreads out as if on a map, with the various plantations and the Waianaa mountains as a background.

"We will keep on the edge of the Land Company's tracks"

"We keep mauka all the time and with the exception of the grade of which I have already spoken have practically a level track all the way. When we reach a point almost directly opposite the entrance to the naval reserve, we swing makai and then the first time will cross the Oahu Railroad and
