Huge Tiger Skin, Bolts of Silk, Sables and Silver Brought by Special Ambassador.

WASHINGTON, December 11.—Mrs. Roosevelt today received the gifts

brought from China by Special Chinese Ambassador Tang Shao Yi. They consist of a handsome tiger skin lined with yellow silk and said to be one of the largest in existence, as well as bolts of beautiful silk sables and silver.

## LABOR PEOPLE ARE EXCITED

Sentences of Leaders Cause Deluge of Protests to President Roosevelt.

VENEZUELA IS AGAIN IN GOOD ODOR.

Dynamiter of Grafters Gets His Deserts—Assassin of Stevens Just Saves His Neck.

WASHINGTON, December 24.—The sentencing of President Gompers of the American Federation of Labor to jail for one year, and Secretary Frank Morrison and Vice President John Mitchell to six and nine months, respectively, by Justice Wright of the District of Columbia Supreme Court, has created a sensation throughout the labor circles of the country. President Roosevelt is being deluged with telegrams protesting against the carrying out of the sentences.

### LIFE FOR DYNAMITER.

OAKLAND, December 24.—Claudine, the Greek, arrested as the perpetrator of the dynamiting outrage at the home of ex-Supervisor Gallagher, has been found guilty. He waived time and was immediately sentenced to life imprisonment at San Quentin. The jury was out only eight minutes before arriving at a verdict.

### GOOD FRIENDS AGAIN.

WASHINGTON, December 2.—The Government of the United States has resumed friendly diplomatic relations with the government of Venezuela. Yesterday, W. I. Buchanan, who was the first American Minister to Panama and who has served in various diplomatic capacities in Central America since 1894, sailed on board the cruiser North Carolina for Caracas. He will investigate conditions in Venezuela and report to the State Department.

### STEVENS' SLAYER CONVICTED.

SAN FRANCISCO, December 24.—Chang, the Korean patriot, has been found guilty of murder in the second degree for the killing of D. W. Stevens, the political adviser of the Japanese government, in San Francisco.

### OFFICIAL COMING WEST.

SAN FRANCISCO, December 24.—W. R. Wheeler, Assistant Secretary of the Department of Commerce and Labor, has accepted the position of manager of the Traffic Bureau of the San Francisco Merchants' Exchange.

## PEER'S SON IS CRUEL HUSBAND

TACOMA, (Wash.), December 12.—Mrs. Jessie Drummond-Hay, claiming to be the daughter-in-law of Lord Drummond-Hay, the British peer and former Ambassador to Russia, was divorced from Edward Drummond-Hay yesterday by Judge Clifford. The defendant, with their two sons, is traveling in Europe.

In court Mrs. Drummond-Hay stated that her husband had exhausted two fortunes in high living, and, although wealthy yet, he had always been pennurious toward her, according her "coarse and brutal" treatment in return for her care and attention. When he added blows to his abuse, she said, she left him and came to Shelton, Mason county, and, preferring the life of a simple country "school ma'am" to the existence he forced upon her, she taught school.

"Although my husband was in Canada and I was here, I was not safe from his persecutions, for he even attached my miserable pittance from the school to pay an old grocery bill which had been incurred by me while I was living with him. My love for our two sons was the only tie which has bound me to my husband all these years. When I notified him of my intention to secure a divorce he told me that I could go to — and get a cheap American divorce; and he would keep the children. He has our two sons, Leonard and Eric, 13 and 11 years. I believe they are being educated in London, for the last address of my husband was Hotel Cecil, London."

Mrs. Drummond-Hay owns considerable property in Minto and Belmont, Manitoba. They were married at Brandon, Canada, October 3, 1893. The decree issued by Judge Clifford awards the custody of the boys to her. The court has no jurisdiction to bring them away from their father, but Mrs. Drummond-Hay anxiously inquired if she would have the power of the law with her should she succeed in bringing the boys across the ocean. She was told that if her husband was not a fit and proper person to have custody of them any court would sustain her decree.
