Gems from His Nice Speeches.

Turns by Which the Demo-Pop Orator Earns His Applause - He is Still in the West.

These are selections from the speeches Wm. J. Bryan is now delivering for the Demo-Pop campaign committees in a number of the western states:

"I must apologize for quoting the Declaration of Independence. It is under a cloud now, but the clouds will roll by."

"In 1860 Lincoln wrote to Congress a warning against monarchy. What would he think if he were alive today?"

"The money question is not dead. The Republicans say they have buried it, but I assert the corpse is so lively it will be here in 1900."

"In December, 1898, when a treaty of peace with Spain was in hand and before the Filipino war McKinley asked Congress for an army of 100,000 men. If you don't know what militarism means look at France, where an army caused the unjust conviction of a man who was pardoned at the behest of foreign public opinion."

"Republicans give three reasons for imperialism: Money in it, God's in it, and we're in it."

"I affirm we can whip the Filipinos. We whipped Spain, and she almost whipped the Filipinos in 300 years, and then sold us the option in the fight for \$20,000,000."

"England has been trying to civilize and convert India with gunpowder gospel for 150 years, and less than 5 per cent of the people are Christians. If we try to put God in the Philippines it is only a question of time until the issue will be transferred here, and we will be shooting our particular creeds into one another for the glory of the Lord."

"I wouldn't trade the glory and honor of this republic for the glory of all the empires that have risen or sunk since Egypt. I believe this nation ought to instantly establish a Filipino republic and say to the world, 'Hands off.'"

"I understand that President McKinley had no policy until his Omaha trip, when he is said to have gathered public sentiment from the rear of a train. If he had consulted me I could have told him how unreliable is public sentiment gathered from the rear of a train. I haven't forgotten 1896."

**CUP CHALLENGER.**  
 MONTREAL, Oct. 26.—H. Barclay Stevens, former vice-commander of the Royal St. Lawrence Yacht Club, and owner of the steam yacht Dana, and some other well-known yachtsmen, are working to form a syndicate to challenge for the America cup through the Royal Nova Scotia Yacht squadron. If the plan materializes and a challenge should be accepted the boat is to be built in Nova Scotia.

**TORONTO, Oct. 26.**—The Royal Canadian Yacht Club would like to know what to do with the Canada cup, won by the Genesee last August. It is still in possession of the club. The club has not received instructions as to forwarding it, and it is quite possible that it may be handed over to the Rochester Yacht Club, to which the Genesee belongs, and by the Rochester yachtsmen to the Chicago Yacht Club, the challengers in the international contest.

**CHOATE ON AMERICANS.**  
 LONDON, Oct. 27.—United States Ambassador Choate, at a banquet given this evening by the Mayor of London, responding to the toast "The Anglo-Saxon Race," dwelt upon the blend of various races in America. The American, he said, was neither English, Scotch, Irish nor an imitation of the people of any other nation in Europe, but combined them all, and the composition was a new and perfect blend. America had settled all her controversies with England with peace and honor, he said, and the English-speaking people had achieved and were daily achieving wonders for civilization.

**VOLUNTEERS AT MANILA.**  
 MANILA, Oct. 27.—9 P. M.—An informal meeting was held here this evening of men proposing to proceed to South Africa to fight for the British. More than a hundred Englishmen, Australians and Americans decided to go. They organized a party and believe they can secure 200 more men. The volunteers include ex-soldiers, frontiersmen, Englishmen familiar with the Transvaal and commercial clerks.

**KAISER WILL GO TO WINDSOR.**  
 LONDON, Oct. 27.—The Berlin correspondent of the Daily Mail says: "All the arrangements have been completed for Emperor William's visit to the Queen. His majesty will arrive in England on November 20th and remain at Windsor Castle five days, after which he will go to Sandringham for a two days' visit to the Prince of Wales."
