Late Foreign News. By the arrival of the brigantine Hesperian and the bark Lady Lampton from the Coast we receive the following items of foreign news:

LONDON, February 16th.—If the strike of colliers in South Yorkshire lasts another fortnight it will affect 30,000 men. The greatest destitution prevails.

DUBLIN, February 16th.—It is reported that an attempt to ignite a large dynamite mine under the wall of Beggar's Bush barracks last night was frustrated by a chance person passing.

BEYRUT, February 16th.—The Turks murdered a Christian, and a number of Christians left town and went to their villages, where they were met by the Turks, and ten persons were killed in the fight which ensued.

CANBARR, February 18th.—A division of the Amer's army, consisting of four regiments of infantry and 1,000 cavalry, has arrived at Ghersini. The news caused a great sensation.

The Merv chiefs have resolved to resist the Russians to the last, and the elders have gone to Candahar seeking aid.

ALEXANDRIA, February 15th.—Henri Læzzeret, the French explorer in Africa, and all his suite, have been murdered by the Gallas tribes.

LONDON, February 15th.—It is rumored in Cork that Fenians in America and the United Kingdom are aiding the Boers with men and money. It is said that 500 American adventurers have gone to the seat of war.

Large bodies of Boers are reported moving south of Newcastle, apparently to attack the reinforcements.

One hundred seamen are ordered to Transvaal from Sheerness, to form a naval brigade.
