The schooner **Eva** sailed for San Francisco yesterday. She took away 6,442 packages of sugar weighing 777,208 pounds. Domestic value, \$51,814 65.

The bark **C. R. Bishop** sailed for New York yesterday. Her cargo consists of 26,471 packages of sugar weighing 2,650,156 pounds, 100 lbs. coffee, 1,806 pos. hides, and 39 calf skins. Domestic value, \$170,346 33.

The pleasant trade blew a good breeze yesterday, much to the satisfaction of old residents, who invariably feel that something is wrong without the trade.

Recent departures leave in port six vessels, now or soon to be available for loading domestic exports, and the already large stock of sugar and rice on hand is daily increasing, so that activity will reign in the shipping business for some time to come.
