We heard yesterday that the disease known as "pink-eye" in horses, has made its appearance in town, probably brought by recent importations. As the disease is said to be peculiarly infectious, owners of stock had better be on their guard. Would it not be well to have importations of this kind carefully examined before being allowed to land?

We regret to learn that a case of measles was reported yesterday as having broken out on Monday, in the family of Mrs. J. G. Dickson, on Beretania street. The premises have been placed under quarantine. The family came as passengers from San Francisco on the City of New York, and it has been suggested that the disease came by that ship. But then we are told by physicians that the period of incubation of measles rarely exceeds six days, and the passengers in question landed sixteen days since.
