Announcement is made in New York that Puckey Macfarland and Jack Briton, both of Chicago, have been matched to meet at Madison Square Garden, November 11.

The Turkish town of Tushi surrendered to the Montenegrins yesterday afternoon. This opens the way to Scutari, where Turkish forces are said to be concentrating and on which the Montenegrin troops are advancing.

Speaking at a banquet in his honor tendered by the Portland chamber of commerce, Maj. Gen. Leonard S. Wood, chief of staff, U. S. A., told his hearers to disabuse themselves of the idea that there is any plan on foot to build up in this country a great military power.

It is officially announced that 3000 Turks were captured at Tushi. King Nicholas, who had been watching the engagement, entered the fort and hoisted the Montenegrin flag.

A great Montenegrin victory over the Turkish troops was announced today by Prince Peter, of Montenegro, in a telegram to his former tutor at Heidelberg.

Official confirmation that Ottoman troops have crossed the Serbian frontier reached the foreign office this evening from the French minister in Belgrade.

President Taft reviewed in the North river the greatest assemblage of American warships ever gathered together in American waters, the long column extending from Twenty-fourth street to Yonkers, or fifteen miles, five miles of which were of first-class battleships alone.

The cruisers and special type boats lay at anchor further up the stream, while running parallel to the line of battleships were the torpedo boats and destroyers.

Yesterday the great fleet was reviewed by Secretary of the Navy Messer.

The second X-ray picture taken to locate the bullet in Colonel Roosevelt's side has been developed and has proved successful. It shows the bullet is firmly wedged against the fourth rib on the right side. The bullet is in a harmless position and will not be removed unless it irritates the flesh surrounding it.

"We have located the exact course of the bullet, and have definitely determined that it did not touch a vital spot. Colonel Roosevelt's life is not in any danger," was the latest bulletin issued by the doctors caring for Roosevelt.

"Carrying that speech in your pocket," Dr. Ochsner remarked, "was the luckiest thing you ever did." "That speech would stop more than a bullet," answered the colonel; "it was a great speech."

"Col. Roosevelt's pulse at this hour is 90.2; his respiration, 20. No operation to remove the bullet is intended at the present time. Col. Roosevelt's condition is hopeful, but the wound is so important as to demand absolute rest for a number of days."

"I am shocked at the occurrence, but nevertheless hopeful," said Mrs. Roosevelt, as she and her daughter, Ethel, and son, Theodore Roosevelt, started for Chicago to be at the bedside of Colonel Roosevelt.

BY AUTHORITY REGULATIONS GOVERNING USE OF THE 10" FUEL OIL PIPE LINE OWNED BY THE TERRITORY OF HAWAII AND LOCATED ON THE HONOLULU WATERFRONT AND WHARVES.

Adopted by the Board of Harbor Commissioners, September 11, 1912. Control of Pipe Line.

(1) The pipe line shall be under the control of the Board of Harbor Commissioners, whose employees shall work in conjunction with the firms, corporations, or individuals using the pipe line; so that every facility will be secured for the prompt and accurate despatch of the delivery of oil to or from ships or other users of fuel oil.

Charges for Use of Line. (2) For the first six months of its use, the charge shall be at the rate of .01 1/2 per barrel of oil pumped through the line either from ships to tanks, or from tanks to ships, or other users of fuel oil. After this period, the charge for the use of the line shall be based to cover— 1st. Cost of operation, maintenance and repair.

2nd. Interest on investment and depreciation. 3rd. Refunding annually an amount equal to 1-20 of bonded debt for line, said charge to be determined by the Board of Harbor Commissioners.

Permits to Use Line. (3) Permits to use the pipe line will be granted only to those firms, corporations or individuals who are in a position to deliver oil to or from vessels berthed at Government wharves at a minimum volume of 1000 barrels per hour.

Delivery of Oil To and From Vessels. (4) To regulate delivery of fuel oil to ships berthed at Government wharves, no barge or oil tank, vessel or other container, will be permitted to discharge oil to, or receive oil from any vessel berthed at a Government wharf in the Harbor of Honolulu during such time as the 10" Fuel Oil Pipe Line is in condition to properly receive oil from or deliver oil to ships berthed at wharves owned or controlled by the Territory of Hawaii.
