ISLAND TOUR FOR REPUBLICANS
There will be something doing at Wai'alua tomorrow night. The regular Republican nominees and their lieutenants will assemble in the headquarters tomorrow morning, and, after receiving instructions from the leaders, will proceed to Kahana, where they will have a heart-to-heart talk with the electorate there.
Leaving there, they will proceed to Waialua, arriving there in time to settle down before addressing one of the mass meetings arranged for tomorrow night.
Oscar P. Cox, an old warhorse in politics, will be chairman of the meeting, and, judging from the reports received today from Waialua, it is expected that the meeting will be a great success. The candidates will return after the meeting.
BANANAS AND POI DEMOCRATIC SUBJECTS
In speeches at a meeting of voters assembled last night at the railroad depot, the Democratic candidates and runners attacked the Republican administration most vigorously. The speakers said that during the banana-mosquito-poi campaign, the Hawaiians suffered considerably. Their homes, they said, were entered by the health authorities without authority at law, and their banana trees destroyed without consulting the owners.
G. K. Keawehaku asserted that the health authorities practically starved the Hawaiians when they ordered the Chinese poi shops closed, and compelled them to buy the poi from the Kalihi poi factory.
The speakers were listened to attentively by the five hundred people present.

SPRECKELS SUIT ESTABLISHES POINT
Judge Says Wife Has No Vested Interest in Husband's Estate
SAN FRANCISCO—A new interpretation was given yesterday to the law regarding a wife's community interest in her husband's property by Attorney Peter F. Dunne in Superior Judge J. N. Seawell's court, where he argued in behalf of John D. and Adolph Spreckels' demurrer which they had interposed to a suit brought against them by Rudolph and Claus A. Spreckels and their sister Emma Ferris of England.
The suit which was filed last December seeks to recover from John D. and Adolph Spreckels stocks and bonds aggregating \$3,000,000 which were presented to them by their father, Claus Spreckels, during the lifetime. In addition the complainants ask for the income of these stocks and bonds from the time of the presentation which would approximate a total of \$14,000,000 sued for.
The gifts were made between 1898 and 1905, during which time Rudolph and Claus and Emma Ferris were estranged from their father. During this time John and Adolph co-operated with their father in the management of his sugar interests.
It is claimed by the three plaintiffs that their father was worth \$36,000,000 prior to 1897 and that he gave \$26,000,000 to the defendants between that date and his death in December, 1908. The plaintiffs claim that a part of this, or the amount sued for, belonged to their mother as her community interest in their father's estate.
When the mother died, shortly after her husband, she bequeathed the remaining \$10,000,000 left by her husband to Rudolph and Claus and Emma Ferris. She excluded John D. and Adolph, as had her husband, and on the same ground that ample provision had been made for them.
John D. and Adolph contested the will, which was broken in the Superior Court, but upheld on appeal to the Supreme Court. Claus, Rudolph and their sister then brought the present suit to have returned to their mother's estate her alleged community interest share of the gifts to their brothers.
Attorney Dunne declared yesterday that there was no such thing as a wife having a vested interest in her husband's estate; that it was merely an expectancy.
The case was continued until 10 o'clock Wednesday morning.
