STIFF FINES FOR OLD OFFENDERS

It was "old home day" for more than one Japanese who played a return engagement at the Larnach matinee this morning, when a troupe of trained gamblers under the direction of Chief of Detectives McDuffie essayed the role of star performers. Officers raided a den of chance last evening and in the melee a considerable quantity of damaging evidence was garnered. Nine Orientals were at first inclined to resist their being dragged before the spotlight of municipal correction.

District Magistrate Larnach was told that several of those who faced his court this morning were old timers in police annals. He scanned the list and a sliding scale of fines then and there went into effect. Financial remuneration ranging from \$20 to six dollars was demanded and paid in full before the Japanese were permitted to leave the premises.

It was an off day for one William Spicer, who had barely stepped from the portals of Hotel Asch before he was confronted with a charge of being under the influence of strong beverage. Spicer pleaded guilty and was handed a thirty-day visitor's card at the Iwilei Club.

In the case of one individual imbibing too freely of a nut brown beverage, a suspended sentence for thirteen months was given with the understanding that the defendant chase a job without further dallying with the cup that causes many men to waiver in their determination to vote the "straight ticket."

The third case of gross intemperance drew a fine of five dollars and the costs of prosecution.

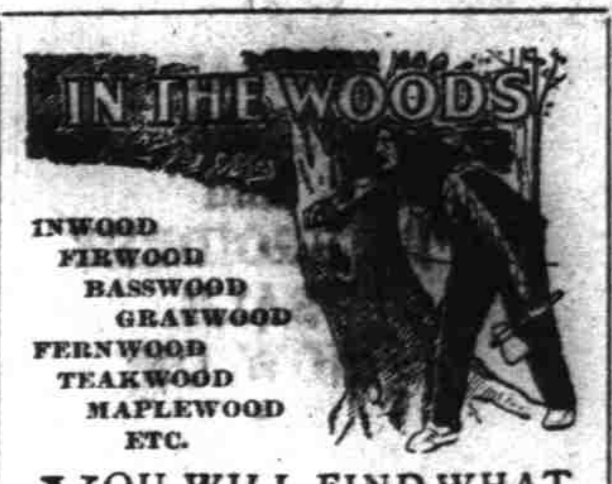
