### OAHU IS SLOWLY HAMMERED DOWN

Oahu is shown active on the decline in today's stock sheet, yet two drops have only reduced it by a quarter point. Between boards there were sales of 20, 100 and 25 shares of Oahu unchanged from yesterday at 25%. On the board 5, 5 and 25 shares went at 25 1/4 and 10, 10, 15 and 5 shares at 25%.

McBryde fell an eighth on the board, 5 shares selling at 5 1/4 and 10 at 5 1/2. Hawaiian Commercial sloughed 1.75 to 40 for a trifle of 5 shares.

Hawaiian Pineapple advanced a quarter on the board, 20, 20 and 20 shares selling unchanged at 44 1/4 and 50, 50 and 50 at 44 1/2. Two \$500 Hilo 1901 sixes sold unchanged at 100 1/4.


