MONIE BACK TEARS FLOW

Youthful Figueroa, in company with his father, held a sorrowful session with Chief of Detectives McDuffie this morning during which interview copious tears flowed, while some four dollars in coin of the realm were recovered, which is alleged to be the property of Chinese business man.

Figueroa, a nine-year-old Ernest Peterson has been placed under arrest charge with participating in a series of petty thefts and burglaries at the Juvenile Court today.

Previously a well-equipped tailor shop had been built and in addition it has an extensive restaurant and also a garage that enjoys good patronage.

Later vaudeville and other attractions will be brought out. It is not the intention of the management to allow the hall to be used by the officers for hope or entertainments until it has been completely dedicated by the real owners—the enlisted force of the regiment.

That dedication will be in the very near future and will probably take the form of a large hop for the men and their families and friends.
