SAN FRANCISCO, November 7.—Late returns in San Francisco give Roosevelt a plurality of 130, a narrow margin which the returns from country precincts may upset when all are received.

Over-Night Wireless To the Advertiser

The Turkish army commanded by Nazim Pasha was completely crushed in the great battle of the last two days of the Sari-Tchorin line, according to semi-official reports received at Sofia today.

The Turks lost in killed and wounded more than double the loss at Luleburgas.

The Bulgarians are now pursuing the defeated army.

The Turkish losses in killed and wounded during the five days of fighting in the vicinity of Luleburgas and Burnarhissar are estimated at 25,000 men; the Bulgarian troops captured thirty-seven batteries of quick-firing guns and took 2000 prisoners. They also seized four locomotives and 243 railroad coaches.

"We will sing the Te Deum of thanksgiving in the mosque of St. Sophia next Sunday," boasted the leaders of the conquering army of Bulgarians today.

It was reported that the great stronghold of Salonica has been evacuated, and that the Turkish army stationed in the city has been withdrawn.

The Turks are reported to have been decisively beaten by the Bulgarians and driven in disorder from their position at the Tchatalja forts in front of Constantinople, according to a dispatch received today from Sofia.

The fleet which the European nations are assembling in Turkish waters will comprise fourteen battle-ships, twenty-two cruisers and fifteen torpedo destroyers and auxiliaries.

Turkey has decided to accept any terms of peace the Powers will recommend, according to statements today in official circles. The Balkan Allies will ask the partition of European Turkey, permitting the Powers to decide the fate of Constantinople.

In an attempt to break the long distance air record, Robert Powell, the aviator, left from Grant Park at eight o'clock this morning to fly from Los Angeles to San Francisco by way of Bakersfield and Fresno.

At the same time, Charles Soule, an automobile racer, started from the court house here to follow Powell's aeroplane up the valley.

President Taft returned to Washington today. The private car of Governor Hadley of Missouri was attached to the President's train in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, and the Governor came to Washington and conferred with Mr. Taft.

With returns in from over half the precincts in Nevada, it is apparent that the senatorial seat left vacant by the death of United States Senator George S. Nixon will be won by Ker Pittman, a Democrat.

Fresh loan negotiations between the Chinese government and the group of bankers representing the United States, Great Britain, Germany, France, Russia and Japan have been opened in Peking, China.

One of the questions that will be discussed in each of the five departments of the American Federation of Labor, which opened its sessions at Rochester, N. Y., today, is whether it would be advisable for workers to organize a political party that will embody their desire for legislation.

Just because Woodrow Wilson is the President-elect of the United States, he does not intend to retire from the fight he has waged for two years for a program of progressive legislation in New Jersey.

As a result of errors found in the unofficial count, the race between Representative Nicholas Longworth (Republican), son-in-law of former President Roosevelt, and Stanley Ebaule (Democrat) for congress in the first Ohio congressional district, is in doubt.

Late returns today swing Minnesota from Wilson to Roosevelt, and the colonel will probably carry the state by about 15,000. Roosevelt found his greatest strength in the rural districts.

Late returns from all except 376 precincts in the State of Illinois give Wilson a plurality of 7186 over Roosevelt.

Wilson's plurality outside of Cook county, which comprises Chicago, was 45,443. The missing precincts are so scattered that no estimate can be made of them. Wilson's vote in Cook county was 305,169 and Roosevelt's was 230,446.

There are still about 560 precincts to hear from and it is thought that they will increase Wilson's lead.
