In all the robber, who entered the rooms through an open window, managed to secure \$15 from the Public Works department and \$14 from the Board of Health.

A special meeting of Kalihi Improvement Club has been called for this evening by H. A. Franzen, the new president. A measure of concern to every resident of this big and growing district is to be brought up for action. The clubhouse, corner of Gulick avenue and Beckley street, should be filled by public spirited residents tonight.

Secretary Mott-Smith is at present engaged in the pleasing pastime of writing his own name, and for every time he writes it the Territory gets a dollar—until he has inscribed the signature 3200 times. He is signing this number of birth certificates for children born in Hawaii of foreign families. There are 800 such certificates completed, lacking only his endorsement, and he must sign each document four times.

The resignation of Miss Ella H. Paris from the board of school commissioners was received and accepted by Governor Frear today. Miss Paris, who was appointed from Kona, Hawaii, has been wanting to take this step for some time, and her resignation is at last accepted by the Governor with deep regret. She sought to be relieved of her duties about a year ago, but consented to remain only at his urgent request. No successor has yet been appointed.
