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POWERS MAKE FIRST MOVE TO STOP STRIFE

WILL FORCE THROUGH REFORM

Leaders Name Steering Committee on Coming Legislation
PLAN TO WORK WITH GOVERNOR FREAR
Harmony in the Ranks of Law-makers is Chief Aim of Party Now

The Republican party in Hawaii is not dead, its loss to the contrary notwithstanding. It is very much alive, and yesterday afternoon the executive committee of the territorial legislature met at the headquarters on Fort Street, and appointed a steering committee which will continue in session until the coming of Governor Frear, and through the many vital reforms in the coming legislature. Some of these contemplated changes are the direct result of the investigation conducted by Secretary Fiala, and others that have resulted from the study of the various reports of the leaders of the party.

CUPID TO DEFER HIS TRIP TO WASHINGTON

Prince Cupid announced this morning that, contrary to reports that he had intended sailing on the Sierra for the coast Saturday, he had decided to remain at home for at least two or three weeks and would not leave Honolulu until just in time to reach Washington Dec. 9. The delegate declined to discuss his plans for the coming session of Congress beyond saying that he expects to be very busy.

LINK WOULD CUT DOWN PAY ROLL

Just a week after the election, and before the local Democracy had wound up the financial tangles of the recent campaign, Link McCandless began laying his plans for the control of the local board of supervisors. Intimation of his scheme came to light when he declared that he would favor a great reduction of the salary roll of the various city departments, a reduction that would, he insists, save the city \$15,000 on her tax roll within the coming two years of Democratic administration.

Waipio valley is in the grip of an epidemic of glanders and the board of health has declared a quarantine over the entire district in the hope of preventing the spread of the plague.

U. S. STARTING BATTLE AGAINST THE HOOKWORM

The insidious hookworm has no place in the contented resident of Hawaii soil, according to the determination reached at Washington. Dr. Trotter, in charge of the United States Public Health and Marine Hospital Service, has been instructed through cable by the authorities at the head of his department at the seat of government, to take steps toward carrying forward a thorough examination of all alien immigrants arriving at Honolulu.

DREAD OF GENERAL WAR IN EUROPE DIES AWAY

Sublime Porte Reported To Be Ready To Open Negotiations Direct With the Balkan Allies

PARIS, France, Nov. 13.—The Powers have agreed to transmit Turkey's proposal for mediation, requesting the Allies to terminate negotiations which they will agree to pursue. This is the first step toward an armistice to stop the war, but it takes an indication that the Allies will allow some latitude in their demands for provisions before peace can be declared.

Turkey Abandons All

BERLIN, Germany, Nov. 13.—According to dispatches received from the Turkish army and the upper classes of officials in the Balkans, it was declared today that the cabinet reported to the Sultan that the military and naval forces are in a position to hold out for a long time, but they are not fit for use.

Call Asquith Traitor

LONDON, Eng., Nov. 13.—A loud outcry of indignation was heard in the lower houses of parliament, Speaker Lyndoch Salomonson today, in the decision of the House of Commons to vote on the resignation of the cabinet was defeated. The Unionists made a strong protest, some screaming out that Asquith was a traitor, but the speaker, in the most soothing terms.

Fifteen Die In Wreck

INDIANAPOLIS, Indiana, November 13.—Fifteen men, women and children were killed near here this morning when a crowded passenger train slipped through an open switch and struck a freight train that was standing on a siding. Information of the disaster reached neighboring towns and medical and other assistance was at once rushed to the spot, but too late to save the lives of many of the injured.

Y., Nov. 13.—Joseph Kane has sued "Rube" Marquard, star pitcher of the New York Giants and now on the vaudeville stage, for \$25,000 damages, alleging alienation of the affections of his wife, Bloomer Seely, the actress, who is Marquard's partner in a vaudeville sketch now being produced.

PENNSYLVANIA RAILROAD LOSES YET PRESIDENT BY RESIGNATION

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Nov. 13.—President Wallace has resigned the presidency of the big Pennsylvania system, which he has held for many years, assigning age as his reason. His successor has not been named.
