HOFESCHLAGER NEW BUILDING

King street is soon to have another business architectural improvement, this to be a store and office building of two stories for Hofeschlager Company, Ltd., general merchants, who have store fronts on Bethel and King streets, another building occupying the corner between. The new structure will substitute the corrugated iron warehouse now used by the firm, which is advertised for sale by the City Auction Co. The new building will be of reinforced concrete, 50 feet long by 21 feet 2 inches deep. It will be simple in design, the treatment being what is called "straightforward" in architect's parlance. The ground floor will be fitted up for a store, and the upper floor for the company's offices. T. Gill is the architect.

BUSINESS ITEMS

After a strong opening on the strength of more favorable European news, the New York stock market yesterday relapsed under a strong selling movement. There was a partial recovery before the close. Call money was firmer, opening at 5/8-4. Hawaiian sugar stocks in San Francisco closed as follows yesterday: H. C. & S. Co., 40 asked; Hawaiian Sugar, 37.50 bid, 38 asked; Honokaa, 10 asked; Hutchinson, 18.25 bid; Kilauea, 18 bid; Onomes, 35 bid; Peanaha, 31 asked; Honolulu Plantation, 34.75 bid, 35.50 asked.

Raymond C. Brown has called to the board of immigration that interview with thirty-five heads of families at Ekaterinberg, Perm, Russia, were mutually satisfactory and if arrangements could be made with the Russian government for their passage, the families would be sent here. It is suggested by Wilbur A. Anderson, who has returned from representing Hawaii at the International rubber exhibition in New York, that moving pictures of the industry in this Territory be made. He saw this rubber countries advertised in that way on the mainland. While the exhibit put Hawaii on the rubber map of the world, it was lacking in having no "Hawaii Day" reception, such as Brazil and other countries had, because the materials for such were not available. As already mentioned in reports of Hawaii at the exhibition, the Star-Bulletin, Hawaiian promotion literature was distributed and information disseminated in personal interviews.
