The Turkish request for mediation by the Great European Powers was presented to the Bulgarian premier this afternoon by the minister of the Great Powers.  
An official dispatch from Arta says the conduct of the Turks in Epirus was like that of men anxious to destroy their possessions because they could not retain them.  
One detachment, acting under the orders of the Janina chief of police, pillaged and burned thirty-one villages in Janina district in the last few days.  
In the neighborhood of Janina alone there are 1000 women and children dying of hunger. Eighteen hundred destitute Christians have succeeded in reaching Greek villages.  
As Governor of New Jersey, President-elect Woodrow Wilson today issued his annual Thanksgiving Day proclamation, drawing attention to the conduct of the political campaign just closed, "with out violence or passion."

An agreement between the United States and Russia to take the place of the commercial treaty of 1832, the abrogation of which becomes effective January 1 next has been virtually reached, according to information from high official authority.

Lars Anderson of Washington, now minister to Belgium, has been named as United States ambassador to Japan to succeed Charles F. Bryan, whose resignation was announced a few days ago through the Japanese embassy.

Taking the stand in his own behalf, Harry Horowitz, alias "Gyp, the Blood," on trial in this city with three other gangsters of New York for the slaying of Herman Rosenthal, the gambler, on July 16, in front of the Hotel Metropole, denied that he or any of the others shot Rosenthal. The witness admitted that he was near the scene of the crime, but insisted that a strange man did the shooting.

Count Alvarado de Romannonen, president of the chamber of deputies, has been selected by King Alfonso to form a new cabinet, in consequence of the assassination of Premier Samojew.

Direct charges against Frank M. Ryan, president of the International Association of Bridge and Structural Ironworkers, that he had full knowledge of explosions, and that he even advised the dynamiters to disguise themselves, were made by Orde Manginal, in his confession in the "dynamite conspiracy" trial today.

Possibility of a strike of 9000 teamsters, chauffeurs and helpers, comprising the local unionists' union, developed in Chicago today when 9000 members of Local Union No. 785 went on strike because of a wage disagreement.

A cablegram was sent the authorities in Honolulu yesterday by the local Police to arrest Chin But Hang, former treasurer of the Tin Yee Kang Gow, a San Francisco benevolent association on his arrival tomorrow in that city.

Chin But Hang is alleged to have decamped with funds belonging to the Tin Yee Kang Gow society.
