## MANIAC AND DYNAMITE EMPTY HOSPITAL

### GRAFT RUMORS START IWILEI VICE INVOLVED

#### Report Federal Grand Jury Will Probe Charges Womer Were Made To "Give Up" \$15 Each—Temporary Closing Of District Starts Stories

Sensational charges that graft money has been recently collected from women of the Iwilei vice-district will be brought to the attention of a new federal grand jury that was sworn in today, according to reports that have been going the rounds since yesterday and which became stronger this morning when the grand jury was impaneled.

The charges of graft have been about for three days, or since last Saturday, and the whole host of rumors, mostly vague but in some cases startlingly definite, grew out of the "closing" of Iwilei for eight days by the police, at the instance, according to police officials, of the U. S. district attorney's department.

### MADMAN BRANDISHES EXPLOSIVE IN WARDS

#### Police Headquarter In Los Angeles Terrorized For More Than Two Hours Before Crazy Unknown Is Finally Knocked Down And Stunned By Detective, Who Catches Box Of Giant Powder As It Falls From Fanatic's Hand

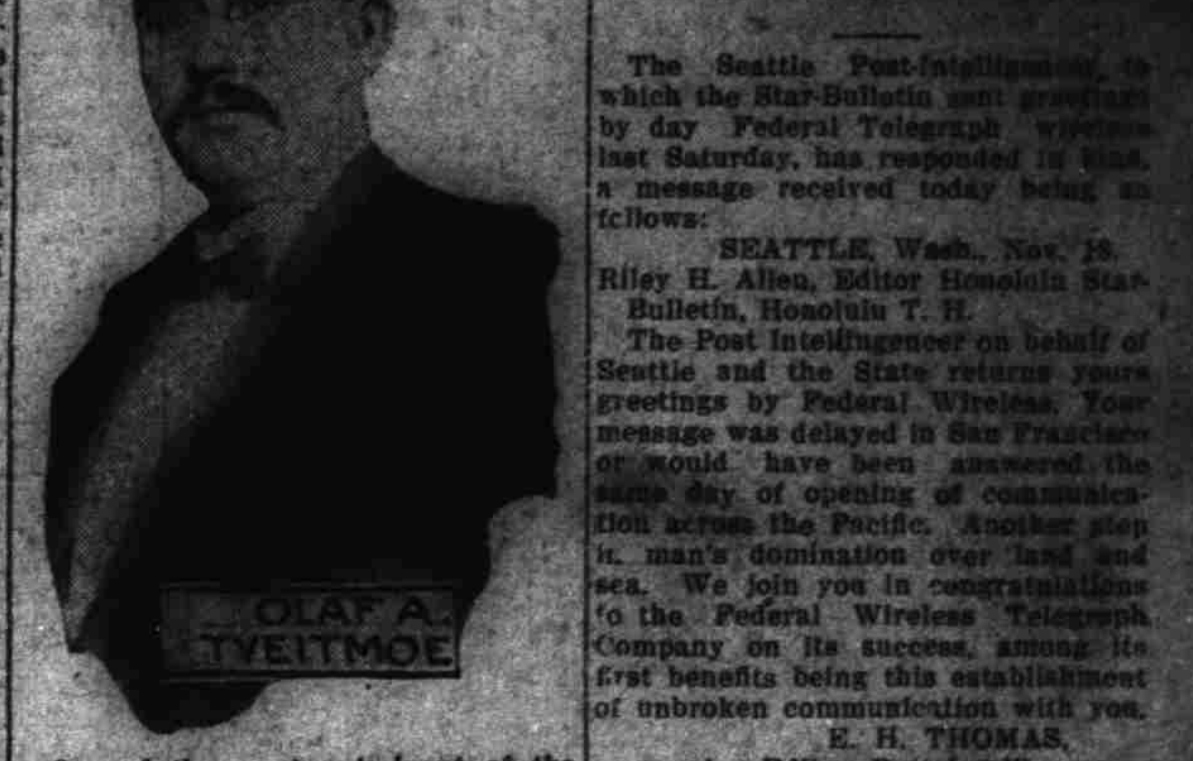
### EDUCATION BOARD WORKING BUDGET FOR COMING TERM
