PEACE AGENTS TO BE NAMED

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 19.—Peace plenipotentiaries will be appointed tomorrow by the Turkish government to meet Bulgarian commissioners for the purpose of framing the terms for an armistice first and a permanent peace to follow.

The occupation of Alessio by the combined Serbian and Montenegrin armies, giving them another stronghold on the Adriatic sea, is considered in diplomatic circles likely to aggravate the Austro-Serbian dispute which has again become critical. Emperor Franz Joseph is reported to have remarked:

"We are in favor of peace, but not of peace at any price. We can not stand over this."

The slaughter during the Bulgarian attack on the Tebatzja defenses during the last few days has been awful. Corpses lie thick within and without lines from the Black Sea to the Sea of Marmora.

No estimate has been made public of the number who have fallen in the continuous fighting along the Tebatzja lines, but there is no doubt that from 30,000 to 40,000 men are dead and wounded on both sides, and it is more than probable that these figures will be exceeded.

Billy Papke and Frank Klaus have been signed up to meet in a twenty-round bout at the Cirque de Paris, the biggest boxing club of France, on the night of December 4, for the middle-weight championship of France.

Jim Giffin, promoter, has been selected as referee for the Wolgast Ritchie fight which takes place on Thanksgiving Day.

The first steps toward making yacht and power boat racing one of the great features during the 1915 Panama-Pacific Exposition were taken today at a conference of exposition officials, representatives of the various yacht clubs of the Pacific and Sir Thomas Lipton, millionaire British sportsman, now in San Francisco for that purpose. To stimulate interest in the great regatta, it is proposed to hold Sir Thomas has promised to put up a handsome Lipton trophy.

The question as to whether California has given a majority to Theodore Roosevelt or to Woodrow Wilson in the recent elections remains as yet undecided. The main contest is over one thousand votes in Los Angeles county and it is certain that the validity of these particular ballots will have to be taken to the courts for settlement.

Mal-Gen. Henry Clay Merriam, retired, died at his home yesterday after an illness of nearly two years. General Merriam was born at Houlton in 1837 and in 1862 was commissioned captain in the Twentieth Maine Regiment at Antietam.

Arriving at Bermuda, President-elect Woodrow Wilson of the United States declared to day that he has begun to forget politics. The injury received by Mr. Wilson in an automobile accident before the election does not trouble him any more.

A severe earthquake shock occurred at Mexico City at quarter-past seven o'clock this morning. The movement was oscillatory and passed from north to south. It lasted more than three minutes. A number of brick walls were thrown down and several persons were slightly injured.

Ortie E. McManigal will resume his story of dynamitings by the forty-seven union men charged with illegally transporting dynamite, at Indianapolis, probably tomorrow.

Davis, the maniac who terrorized the police headquarters at Los Angeles with an infernal machine, recovered consciousness from the blow dealt him by an officer. He said: "I came to Los Angeles yesterday."

In addition to the box, which contained sufficient dynamite to wreck the building, Davis' pockets were filled with sticks of dynamite. He also carried a forty-five caliber revolver.

Revising their first report that five persons had lost their lives, the police announced today that the known death list of the fire that destroyed the St. George Hotel at Los Angeles early today, contains three names. They are Mrs. Charles Harrington, age thirty-five, an actress whose stage name was Ellen Moran; Joseph Martin, age thirty-eight, a jewelry clerk, Charles Malone, age thirty-five, hotel engineer.
