WIRELESS LEAK; JOHNSON MAD

When the wireless operators stationed in the Oceanic liner Sonoma that arrived at Honolulu on October 28 caught from the air a message from the a-lion Navigation steamer Wilhelmina telling of much loss of deck cargo because of heavy seas, which for hours surged over the deep laden vessel, Captain Peter Johnson is alleged to have got exceedingly wroth through the circulation of the story that over one hundred tons sand and salt had been washed overboard as well as some seventy five feet of rail. It is alleged that one or more wireless operators in the Wilhelmina have been let out, and that new men, who are better pledged to secrecy have been substituted.
In defense of the men who are declared to have incurred the displeasure of the veteran skipper in the Wilhelmina it is claimed that both the Pacific Mail liner Manchuria as well as the Oceanic Sonoma were in more or less constant touch with the Wilhelmina, then laboring through tremendous seas.

MORE PEOPLE FROM SPAIN

The board of immigration is planning to bring one or two more shiploads of immigrants from Spain, and is conferring with the Spanish consul over arrangements. It is said that transportation can now be obtained, which was impossible earlier this year in consequence of which Spaniards and Portuguese assembled at Gibraltar could not be brought out and had to be allowed to return to their homes. It is stated that Raymond C. Brown has been ordered from Russia to the south of Europe to attend to this matter. Dr. Victor S. Clark is on his way home from Russia, expecting to reach here in the Sonoma on December 23.
The consul has reported to the board on conditions he found in an inspection of conditions of the Spaniards on the plantations, making suggestions of various little changes to enhance their contentment. Accordingly recommendations will be made to the plantation managers, which it is expected will be carried out.

BUSINESS ITEMS

Hawaiian stocks closed yesterday in San Francisco as follows: Hawaiian Commercial, 40 asked; Hawaiian Sugar, 30 bid; Honokas, 10 asked; Hutchinson, 18.25 asked; Kilauea, 12 asked; Onomea, 35 asked; Paauhau, 20.50 asked; Honolulu Plantation, 35 asked.
Home politics as well as the Balkan war caused heyness with irregularity on the New York stock exchange yesterday. Oil stocks were conspicuous for their activity and strength. Canadian Pacific, Union Pacific and copper also were exceptions to the general reaction. Call money was in light demand and unchanged.

KEKAHA PLANTATION GETS WATER LICENSE EXTENDED

The Territorial government has granted a nextension of two and one-half years to the ditch and water on the lands of the Waimea Commission held by the Kekaha Plantation pany on Kaula, so that this license will expire seven and one-half years from the present time, or simultaneously with the reversion of the Kekaha plantation to the government.
The extension of the ditch and water license has been made on the understanding that the Kekaha plantation will construct a power plant and make other improvements reaching a total valuation of about \$150,000, which shall come into the government's possession at the same time that the plantation land reverts to the Territory.
Governor Frear thinks this irrigation system will be worth about \$400,000 by the time the license expires. The sale of the water to the plantation in the meantime also provides a definite revenue, so, taken collectively, the Chief Executive considers the deal highly satisfactory to the Territory.
