'BILLY' KENT IS SENT BACK TO WASHINGTON

Honolulu people who know 'Billy' Kent, the California progressive—and there are many who do know him—will be glad to know that according to the latest returns from California, he has been sent back to Washington to represent the first congressional district.

Kent wins his seat in Congress from the First District by 1793 plurality, according to nearly complete returns received when the last news was sent to Hawaii.

With only 34 precincts yet to hear from, Kent was given a total of 19,415 against 17,833 for Zumwalt, his Democratic opponent.

This is a plurality that could not be possibly overturned by and gains that the Democrat might make in the missing districts. And it is likely that the results will be a stand-off in the remaining precincts.

Kent's plurality had been constantly lengthened with later returns from the various counties.

Commenting on Kent's election, the San Francisco Bulletin says:

"California's First Congressional district did the State and the nation a good service when it decided to send William Kent back to Washington.

"Seldom has a candidate for Congress overcome opposition as formidable and as bitter as that which stemmed effort was made to convince party candidates made him the target of their attacks. His every official act was misrepresented, and a determined effort was made to convince the voters that he was a foe of all the industries of the district. The basis of this act was Kent's feasciousness in voting to reduce tariff duties which were enabling trusts to reap an exorbitant profit. Although he himself owned 300,000 pounds of wool last year, he voted for a bill providing for a big cut in the wool tariff.

Kent played no favorites. Before his first election he told his constituents that he would do no log-rolling but would strive for legislation that would yield the greatest good to the greatest number. He kept his word, and, fortunately the men and women of the First California district were patriotic enough to appreciate that kind of service."

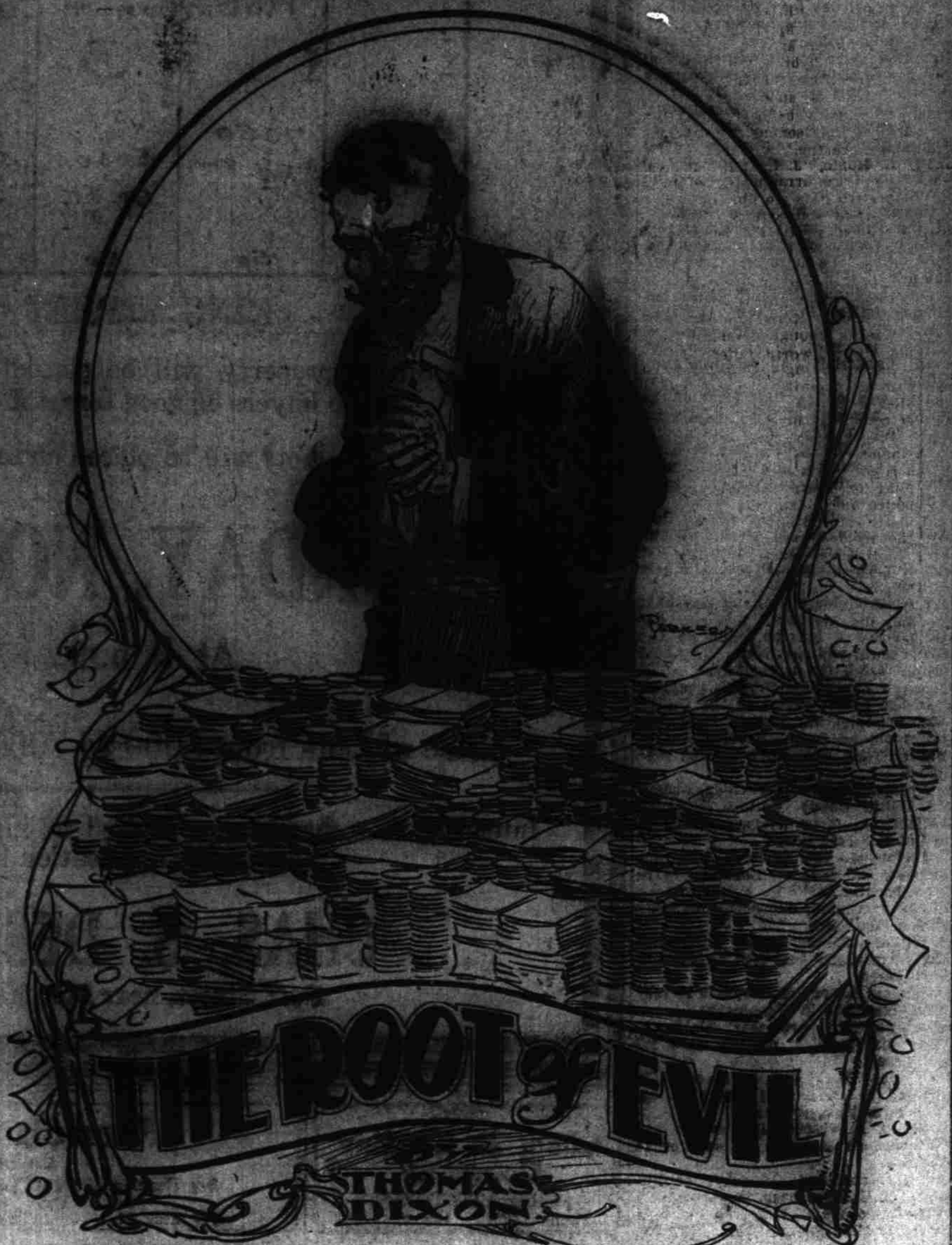
