ARMY AND NAVY

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 6.—The trip of the new revenue cutter Unalga across the Atlantic, from Norfolk to Gibraltar, on the first leg of her voyage to the Pacific coast, demonstrated, according to reports, that the cutter was a good sea vessel and that she was economical as to fuel. On the trip she encountered one gale, during which she was obliged to heave to for several hours to ride out the violence of the storm. Her behavior at that time showed that she is an excellent seacraft in heavy weather.

When the vessel left Norfolk she had 271 tons of coal in her bunkers, and when Gibraltar was reached she had sixty tons. As the distance she traveled was 3400 knots, this gives her a running distance of about sixteen knots per ton of coal which is considered a good showing. The trip was made under easy conditions, and at a speed of about ten knots per hour, with but one boiler in use much of the time.

That the ship has tanks large enough to carry an ample supply of water is shown by the fact that when she reached Gibraltar 1100 gallons of drinking water were still in the tanks and 11,000 gallons of water for boiler feed were left in her reserve tank. The Unalga is now on her way to Port Said to pass through the Suez canal.

A system of indicating instantly and briefly the effect of artillery fire as observed by aviators will be developed during the present maneuvers at Fort Riley, Kan. Wireless communication will be depended upon primarily, but a system of flag signals will be perfected as an auxiliary, to be used if the wireless apparatus fails.

So far only France has developed a satisfactory system, and this is held as a secret. The United States must

develop its own scheme of transmitting signals. Although the aeroplane would seem valuable in detecting the movements and location of an enemy, it is not for this purpose that the air squad will be used. Scouts are attached to batteries now, and will be relied upon to inform the artillerymen of where their target stands. The aeroplane will be developed as a source of information to the gunners to show them where their fire is landing or where shells are bursting. For this brief, almost instantaneous signals indicating that a shot has fallen short, gone over, or to the right or left will be required.

Three officers from the army aviation school at College Park were sent to Fort Riley. They were greeted with open arms by artillery officers. Expert signalmen and topographers were detailed to work with them. Snow has fallen at Fort Riley, and impeded the work. Little has been done so far. Captain Henessy, who was called to Washington because of the serious illness of former Surgeon General O'Reilly, reported to Signal Corps officers that there was much enthusiasm among artillerymen over the proposed experiments, and that high hope was expressed as to the value of the aeroplane for making observations in connection with artillery fire.

That two officers of the United States cavalry will have places on the team which is to represent America in the Madison Square Garden Horse Show, to be given in New York in the near future, has been practically decided by the War Department. Although Capt. J. A. Baer and Lieut. William H. Shepherd, both of whom are stationed at Fort Myer, and are well known in this city have been mentioned as the logical candidates for the appointments to the American team, nothing definite is yet known as to which officer will be selected to ride in the show.

Both Lieut. Shepherd and Captain Baer said today that they had no official order or knowledge warranting them to make preparations to go to the show. It will probably be several days before the official announcement that two officers are to represent the army at the show will be made by the War Department.

The candidate will have to pass both a physical and a professional examination. No allowances will be made for the expenses of persons appearing for examination. On entering the naval service dental officers are credited with five years' constructive service, and for every five years' service the pay is increased 10 per cent. At the age of sixty-two years a dental officer is retired with three-fourths of the highest pay of his grade at the time of retirement.

Congress will be asked to make appropriation this winter for a considerable number of new submarines.

With this request from the Navy Department will be the correlative demand for more submarine tenders. The next submarines built by the United States will be much larger than those now in commission. The new vessels will be of about 600 tons burden. France and Russia have built submarines displacing upward of 900 tons. One tender is required for each group of five submarines.

VARIOUS TYPES OF BUOYS IN USE

The use of buoys for marking channels and harbors, shoals and rocks, has undergone a marked development in the last decade or more. It is no longer merely a spar or block of wood or a cask, but it has been turned into an instrument to warn the navigators in various ways of hidden dangers, both in daylight and in darkness. There are nun buoys, can buoys, whistling buoys and lighted buoys, all of which have their separate and combined uses, while it is predicted that the time is coming when they will render much of the service now required of lighthouses and lightships and do it just as effectively but a great deal more economically; in fact buoys have been so developed that they are capable of performing many of the duties automatically which heretofore have been intrusted to human beings.

There are light buoys for instance which, with Pintsch illuminating gas, will burn for one year with very little attention beyond that of occasional inspection. Such a buoy, equipped with a lighthouse lens, can be seen as far as the curvature of the earth will permit, which on a clear night is usually a distance of some nine miles.

Many buoys now in operation automatically flash a message across the water similar to the revolving light in the fixed towers on the shore, and there are buoys fitted with an invention which automatically lights the lamp at sunset and puts it out at daylight. Other buoys make their own gas. In marking the channel, nun buoys with their tapering tops are usually placed on the starboard side of the entrances and can buoys, which resemble a boiler in general appearance on the port side. The nuns are painted red the cans black. The Pintsch gas buoys are charged from larger tanks carried on the lighthouse tenders.

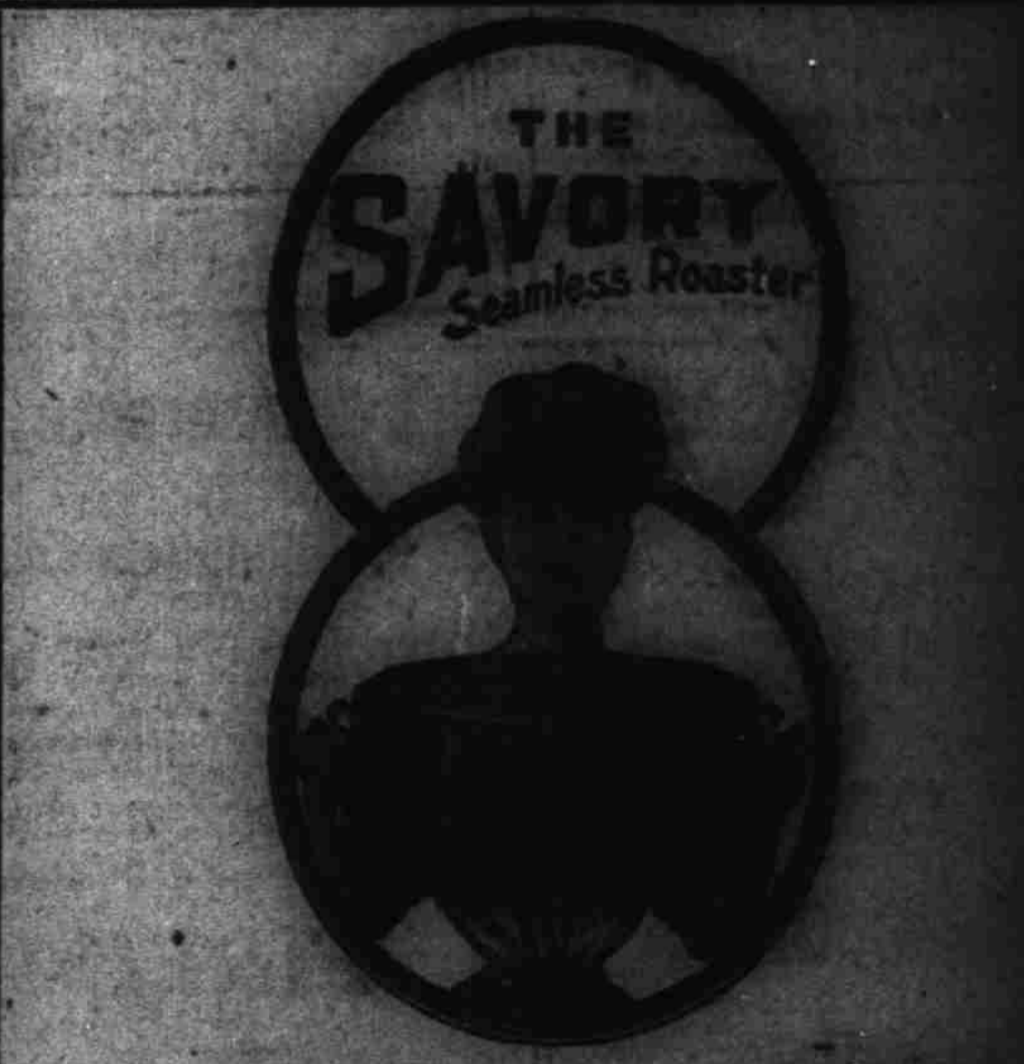
