Sir Thomas Lipton, while in San Francisco, has issued a challenge to all the world for an international yacht race for the championship of the sea, to be held at San Francisco in connection with the Panama-Pacific International Exposition in 1915.

Today Colonel Sam Parker and General John H. Soper of Honolulu, called and paid their respects to Sir Thomas Lipton. During the interview it was suggested that Hawaii might also accept the challenge and enter a boat in the name of Hawaii or Honolulu. Sir Thomas says:

"This ought to be the greatest international yacht race ever held."

Colonel Parker, being particularly interested, suggested that an ocean race from San Francisco to Honolulu be arranged for, to follow immediately after the international yacht race here.

Sir Thomas Lipton was very enthusiastic and said he favored the idea.

Colonel Parker stated he would gladly be one of a syndicate of Hawaiians to undertake the building of this boat and issue the challenge; and would personally subscribe as much as \$25,000 toward the movement, if necessary.

Indication that the Balkan allies will venture all on a terrific frontal attack on the lines of Tebatalla in the hope of crushing Turkey with one blow came here today when 30,000 Greek troops were ordered to help the Bulgarians before Constantinople.

While no official confirmation is obtainable it is the general belief that the Greeks from the vicinity of Salonica and Monastir, and the Servians from the latter fortress, will rush at once toward Constantinople. There, it is believed they will be joined by every Bulgarian who can be spared from the investment of Adrianople.

Dr. S. Danev, president of the Bulgarian parliament, General Savov, Bulgarian commander-in-chief, and General Fitchet, the chief of staff of the Bulgarian army, have been appointed plenipotentiaries for the negotiation of an armistice between the Turkish and Bulgarian armies.

Government officials and other prominent Washington men today almost unanimously disapproved of Andrew Carnegie's plan to pension future retiring Presidents of the United States. It was the general opinion that the acceptance of the pension would be beneath the dignity of ex-presidents.

The Interstate Commerce Commission announced its withdrawal of a recent administrative ruling that shipments to Porto Rico, the Canal Zone and the Philippines were coastwise commerce. Enforcements of the ruling would have barred foreign ships from carrying American commerce to these territories.

Woodrow Wilson today has bright chances of adding California's electoral vote to his total as the result of a decision of the court of appeals, sustaining the contention of the Democratic county central committee regarding the methods of vote counting employed in Los Angeles.

Carl Reidelbach, who threatened to blow up the Los Angeles central police station with an internal machine Tuesday, declared today that he would defend himself on the charge made against him, when he is arraigned for preliminary hearing on Monday.

Resuming his testimony today, Orlo McManigal declared he stole 1200 pounds of dynamite from the Francis Quarry Company, at Bloomville, Ohio, early in 1911. He said he transferred the explosive piecemeal on interurban cars and trains to Indianapolis.

Secretary MacVeagh today asked for the resignation of Gideon C. Bantz, an assistant treasurer of the United States, because he is said to be in sympathy with the administration of the secretary of the treasury.

Sidna Allen, leader of the Allen clan of outlaws, was today sentenced to fifteen years imprisonment for the part he played in the murders committed by the gang in the Hillsville county courthouse.

William Randolph Hearst the publisher, will be one of the first witnesses called before the Clapp senate committee when it resumes its investigation non-congressional contributions next month.
