Heavy selling and low prices prevailed on the New York stock exchange on Saturday. Steel and Union Pacific and Reading railways recovered but copper stocks continued heavy and acted as a drag. There were large sales of distillers along with rumors of possible suspensions of dividends.

L. D. Timmons, formerly manager of the late Hawaiian Star, and one of the best-known newspapermen in the territory, has accepted a position with the Elsie store in the capacity of bookkeeper. Kaula's temple of fashion is to be congratulated on securing the services of such a competent man—Garden Island.

On the 7th inst Cuban sugar was being offered in New York at 2 7/16c. c. and 1. for December (3.80c), 2 1/4c. for January (3.61c.) and 2 1/8c. for February-March (3.49c.), but buyers still withheld from buying for lower contract prices, although indications pointed to completed business soon on the above basis to some extent.

At a meeting of the William McKimley Lodge No. 8, K. of P., held Saturday night, the amalgamation of the three local lodges was unanimously voted upon. Mystic Lodge yet remains to vote, and if the proposition is carried by the organization it will mean that the Knights of Pythias will have one of the strongest fraternal organizations in the islands.

A new ice plant, that will double the capacity of ten tons a day of the present one, has been imported from Omaha by the Hilo Electric Light Company. Its installation will put an end to the shipments of ice from Honolulu to Hilo, amounting to about 100 tons a month. Further, it will prevent the shortages in the supply of ice to the Japanese fishermen which have been frequent.

Discussing the election, the Financial World (New York and Chicago) quotes Wilson's statement in his speech of acceptance—that tariff reductions must be made so that business would not be disturbed or disorganized—with this comment: "The only fair interpretation that can be placed upon this statement is that the President-elect will not permit Congress to rush a tariff bill through simply to establish a reputation for living up to its campaign promises but will approach this vital problem studiously and intelligently. If that be done the business world need have little to fear from tariff reform."
