In the second half Harvard got her off in good shape and carried the ball down the field to within ten yards of the green's goal, where Brickley booted the pigskin over the bar for an easy field goal.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 16.—Playing a fast game from the beginning the University of Pennsylvania football team gained a victory over the Carlisle Indians this afternoon 34 to 26. Until the middle of the last period the final result was in doubt. This is the first defeat of the Indians this season.
