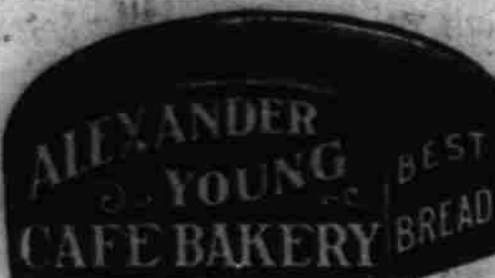

STAR-BULLETIN GIVES YOU TODAY'S NEWS TODAY

\$2,309,750 TO BE NEED FOR ROADS

The report of George Collins, city and county engineer, for the biennial period of 1915-16 has been handed to Mayor John C. Lane.

The report says that the department has under construction by virtue of the frontage tax law \$440,616.74 worth of street improvements of which the city will pay \$119,215.99 and the property holders whom the improvements are to benefit \$321,401.67.

Collins then recommends the following three possible revisions of the frontage tax law:

A change in the amount of the bond exacted from the contractor from 100 per cent to 50 per cent of the amount of contract.

A provision whereby the city of Honolulu may furnish crushed rock and other materials to the contractor on any improvement in lieu of a cash contribution as its share toward the improvement.

There are 474 miles of roads in the city and county of Honolulu exclusive of lanes and alleys, 234 being contained within the city limits.

It is estimated by Collins that it will take \$2,309,750 to complete the road system, \$1,479,750 in the city of Honolulu and \$830,000 for the belt road.

BIG BUSINESSMEN OF NEW YORK COME TO GO GAME-FISHING HERE.

Arriving on the Great Northern next Monday is Foster Milliken and cousin of New York, both of whom are game-fishermen of prominence.

MEXICANS SEEK WAR SUPPLIES

Here is another angle on the celebrated Japanese "mystery freighter" Kotohira Maru, which left Honolulu at 6:15 Wednesday morning for Yokohama, after bunkering here.

The following news story, Associated Press correspondence from Tokyo, says the Kotohira will carry from Japan to Mexico not only ammunition for rifles, but field artillery and machinery for agricultural and industrial purposes.

TOKIO, Japan. — Considerable interest has been caused in Japan by the arrival and activities of three Mexicans, who represent the government of Gen. Carranza, and who are said to be making extensive purchases in behalf of their country.

The Mexican agents, who are in charge of Col. Carpio, are reported to have succeeded in their quest for rifles and even for a steamship. It had been understood that they were negotiating for the freight steamer Kotohira Maru, a vessel of some 300 tons, and the announcement that this steamer cleared from Yokohama on January 2, with its declared destination as Salina Cruz, Mexico, was accepted in some quarters as proof that the negotiations were successful.

In response to inquiries by The Associated Press the Mexican legation at Tokio denied that the Kotohira Maru carried any rifles. The legation admitted that the steamer had sailed for Mexico but said that her cargo was confined to general merchandise and machinery, consigned to a company in Mexico.

It is believed here that the Mexican government recently opened a credit in Japan of \$1,000,000 for the transaction of general business. During the presidency of Gen. Huerta the government of Mexico opened negotiations with Japanese firms for the purchase of rifles and ammunition, depositing some 3,000,000 yen for that purpose in the country.

BELGIAN FIRE CAUSES LOSS OF TEN MILLION

AMSTERDAM, Holland. — Several buildings of the famous Cockerill works at Seraing, five miles southwest of Liege, Belgium, have been destroyed through an incendiary fire, the newspaper Les Nouvelles says.
