## WHARF DREDGING ABOUT TO BEGIN

Actual dredging operations on the quarantine wharf contract will be begun tomorrow or Friday by the Standard American Dredging Company, according to the local U. S. army engineers' offices in this city.

The company has leased the Hawaiian Dredging Company's dredge Kevalo from the local concern and will operate it on the job until the arrival here of its own dredge, the Stockton now in use on another contract.

First work on the quarantine wharf contract will be done right at the wharf site, so the new wharf can be erected as soon as possible. The old structure was torn down many months ago to allow the dredge room to work in. The new wharf will be about 150 yards makai of the old one.

## NAVY IS BEGINNING SURVEY OF MOSQUITO CRAFT; MAY USE THEM

That the "mosquito fleet" in Honolulu harbor stands a chance of being taken over for war purposes if such action should become necessary, is indicated in a circular letter received by local owners of small motorboats, launches and sampans here, from Lieut. Com. Arthur Crenshaw, U. S. N., engineer officer of Pearl Harbor naval station. He is senior member of the joint army and naval board of the local naval district, the fourteenth.

The navy man's circular says that in their own interest, owners of small vessels in the local harbor should call upon him as an officer of the joint board, to take steps that should remunerate them for the impairment of their boats if taken over by the navy. Capt. George R. Clark, commandant of Pearl Harbor, says the board's plan does not signify an early commandeering of the "mosquito fleet" but is part of a survey being taken of all vessels of all sizes, to determine their fitness for war purposes.

## RADIO TO HAWAII AND KAUAI OPEN

Commercial wireless business between Honolulu and Hawaii was reopened this morning by the U. S. Naval radio office, for the first time since April 6. Wireless business between Kauai and Honolulu reopened Wednesday afternoon. Maui and Molokai services are next in line for resumption.

This morning the old Marconi office lettering was replaced by a new sign, reading as follows:

"U. S. Naval Communication Office. Commercial radiograms accepted for all parts of the world and ships at sea." The new window lettering is being put on by U. S. navy workmen.

Robert R. Carlisle, former Marconi operator, was to leave this afternoon for the Kahuku plant, to join the operating force there. Two men have been on duty, an insufficient number. All operators at the former Marconi and Federal stations are now naval reserve operators. Employees not eligible for enrollment have been dismissed by the naval radio service. They include Asiatic employees.
