**Admission Facts.**  
There will be three classes of admission to the Pantomime pageant, all of them by ticket, but all free.  
There will be special reserved seats, the tickets for which will be issued only to the trustees, donors of the annex, and the members of the first class. No tickets for these seats will be given out after tomorrow at 1 o'clock.  
The reserved seat tickets are being issued to each family having children at Punahou, two to each, and these will be given to the students tomorrow.  
The general admission tickets may be secured by the alumni, patrons, college students and the public who may be interested. These can be secured free at President Griffith's office, in Donald Hall; Principal Pitts' office, in Bishop Hall; Treasurer P. C. Jones' office, in the McAndrews building, and from Percy Deverill, at the Bank of Hawaii. The admission tickets do not insure a seat, however, but a very large crowd can be accommodated.  
The entrance will be at the Alexander street gate, automobiles entering by the main gate at Wilder avenue and Punahou street. They will park on the lower field on a line with the old school hall.
