# MANY PEACE PRIZES FOR THE SCHOOLS

The latest announcements for prize essays by the Chamber of Commerce committee emphasize the many opportunities Hawaii students have to compete for prizes.

This now makes ten opportunities for prize essays placed by the Honolulu Chamber of Commerce peace committee before the students of Hawaii since January 1 of this year. Briefly they are summarized as follows:

- 1—Pugsley prize, \$100, open to college and university students.
- 2—Black prize, \$100, open to women university students.
- 3—Black prize, \$200, open to women university students.
- 4—Local prize, \$50, open to all scholars over 15 years of age.
- 5—Seabury prize, \$75, open to seniors in Normal School.
- 6—Seabury prize, \$50, open to seniors in Normal School.
- 7—Seabury prize, \$25, open to seniors in Normal School.
- 8—Seabury prize, \$75, open to seniors in secondary schools.
- 9—Seabury prize, \$50, open to seniors in secondary schools.
- 10—Seabury prize, \$25, open to seniors in secondary schools.

W. A. Bowen of the Chamber of Commerce committee has received from Fannie Fern Andrews, secretary of the American School Peace League, the following letter:

"Mr. W. A. Bowen, 1701 Kewalo St., Honolulu, Hawaii.

"My Dear Mr. Bowen: Mr. H. C. Phillips, secretary of the Lake Mohonk Conference on International Arbitration, has referred your letter, concerning the eligibility of pupils in the Hawaiian schools as contestants in the Pugsley and Black prizes, to me. The enclosed is an announcement of the Peace Prize Contest of the American School Peace League, open to seniors of high and normal schools throughout the world. It would be very gratifying to us if some of your pupils would compete. We shall be very glad to send literature if any of them wish it.

"You will notice on this announcement that the time limit is March 1. We shall be glad to extend this to April 1, or even April 15, if some of the Hawaiian students compete. Under separate cover I am sending you the second and third annual reports of the league and also a package of literature from the World Peace Foundation. This will include general literature, which can be used by pupils in preparing their essays. The winning essays of the previous years are printed in the reports. Most sincerely yours,
