GOOD WORK BY HUMANE SOCIETY. Great satisfaction in the work of the Humane Society was expressed by Mrs. Sanford H. Dole, who was in the president's chair at the monthly meeting yesterday after an extended absence from the city. Children improperly cared for have come under the protecting wing of the Humane Society as well as abused members of the animal kingdom. In Humane Officer Rose C. Davison's report to the society yesterday it was shown that seven children were cared for in various ways during November. In two animal cases that came under the observance of the society it was necessary to order horses killed. Eleven were ordered taken out of harness temporarily, twenty-one were found lame or galled and there were three cases of overloading. Miss Davison's salary was raised. It was announced that the monthly meetings are open to members as well as officers. The gatherings are held on the first Wednesday in each month. CHINESE WOMEN BEGIN RED CROSS WORK TODAY. Bearing banners of Red Cross symbols, a delegation of Chinese women marched through Chinatown this afternoon soliciting funds for the work of aiding the wounded and refugees in the rebellion in China. Meanwhile others were at work preparing bandages under the direction of American nurses who have volunteered their services. Women of all classes are uniting in this work, and are entering into it with an enthusiasm born of the knowledge that they are the first to assert themselves in behalf of their countrymen. By letters just to hand the Hawaii Promotion Committee learns that occasional illustrated lectures are being given by a number of recent visitors to Hawaii. John W. Hamilton, member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, of the firm of Hamilton & Chambers, 29 Broadway, N. Y., sends a copy of the Daily Argus, published at Mount Vernon, N. Y., which gives a full account of a lecture on Hawaii given by him. R. J. Bennett, president of the William W. FOR BENEFIT OF FARMERS

A bulletin dealing with the work of Agronomist F. G. Krauss of the Federal experimental station has just been issued, giving information regarding the leguminous crops that might be grown in the Territory. He suggests that some of the farmers try experiments with the samples of seed supplied by the experimental station and work out the results for themselves. He always lays stress on the fact that good tillage and the use of fertilizers will always repay the farmer. In connection with this bulletin there are also several others issued. Among them are "Brief Instructions to Farm Butter Makers" (Press Bulletin No. 31), by F. A. Clowes, superintendent of Hawaii substations; "Cultural Methods for Controlling the Cotton Boll Worm" (Press Bulletin No. 32), by C. K. McClelland, agronomist, and C. A. Bahr, his assistant; and "The Assimilation of Nitrogen by Rice" (Bulletin No. 24), by W. P. Kelley, chemist.
