ATHLETES FIGURING ALREADY NEXT OLYMPIAD AT STOCKHOLM

The official program and general regulations announced to govern the Olympic games at Stockholm, Sweden, next July, have been noted by the Swedish Olympic Committee and have been received by the United Amateur Athletic Union officials.

Foremost among the regulations included in the schedule for the Olympic games is the condition that the common competitions shall be confined exclusively to amateurs.

Each nation shall be permitted to enter twelve competitors in every individual event, and one team in team events. Must Be Seventeen.

No competitor under 17 years of age will be permitted to participate in the Olympic events. Exceptions may be made in special cases where the entry is accompanied by a doctor's certificate testifying to the athlete's fitness.
