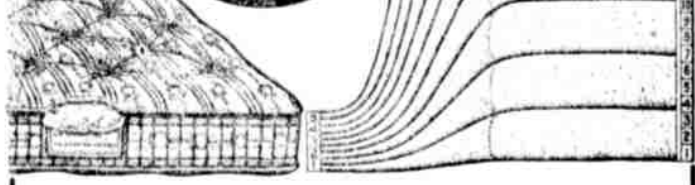

AERO CONTEST INTERESTS BOYS

Many Already at Work Upon Aeroplane Models—After Bulletin Medals.

Announcement made by the Bulletin last Saturday of the Aero Contest for Boys, to the winners of which the Bulletin will give twelve medals, has stirred up great interest among the hundreds of boys who already are deeply interested in aviation and in aeroplane models.

From present prospects there will be a large number of candidates for honors. A number of boys have already gone to work on their models in the whatever class they have picked out, and within a week some will have their models getting into shape.

Secretary Charles E. Loomis, secretary of the contest and director of boys' work at the Y. M. C. A., reports that the interest taken in the contest is remarkably considering that it was announced but three days ago. The simplicity of the rules, the fact that any boy under eighteen can enter, and the number of classes, which gives each boy a chance to pick the model that suits his fancy, all combine to encourage the youngsters, and those who have started are already deeply absorbed in the work.

In Article & Co.'s windows there is a model aeroplane, built by Gus Schaefer, together with an announcement of the Bulletin contest and this is the center of attraction for many a lad after school hours.

The contest runs for a month and then there will be a big exhibition in the game-hall of the Y. M. C. A.—a "junior aero meet," when all the models will be on display.

One bright youngster said yesterday that he is going to enter the glider class, and then try for honors in one of the regular aeroplane classes also. He is only ten years old, but has gone to work already and says he is determined to win one of the Bulletin medals. Another lad, who has been at work upon his model ever since Saturday afternoon, expects to finish it in two weeks and to test it by flying from then on up to the date of the exhibition.

Mr. Loomis stands ready at all times to help the boys with plans and suggestions and to show them what other boys in other parts of the United States have been able to do. He can be reached at the Y. M. C. A.
