FORT SHAFTER NEWS

Definite arrangements have been made for the twenty-one day hike, and it may be interesting to the soldiers at Fort Shafter, as well as other army posts on the island, and also civilians who have soldier-boy friends, to know just exactly where and when to find the boys while they are out on their three-week tour of the island of Oahu. The hike will be an extensive one, and the men will be on the go most of the time after leaving the post, for at no place will they stop more than four days at a time. Instead of leaving one company behind to guard the post, as was done last year, a detachment of men from each company, together with extra and special-duty men, will remain.

Dates and Route.
The battalion will leave the post at 1 p. m. October 7, and march to Pearl City, to remain until the ninth, when they will proceed to Lihouhua. On the tenth a trip over the Kolekole Pass to Waianae will be made. The troops will carry with them two days' rations in haversacks, and the wagon train will proceed from Lihouhua to Waialua and await the arrival of the troops. On the eleventh the battalion will leave Waianae and go to a place near Keena Point, and on the following day, the twelfth, will pass on to Waialua. At no time up to the arrival at Waialua will the troops stop longer than one night at a place, but will remain in Waialua until the fourteenth, to give the men a chance to have a good swim and rest up. The fourteenth will find the battalion on its way to Kahuku Point, and the next day to Laie, where it will remain until the eighteenth, and then proceed to Kahana Bay. Kahana affords a fine bay, and while there in the past the men have spent many hours diving through breakers or resting along the beach. Kahana country is also fine for mountain climbing, and Captain Chapman has decided to remain there four days, leaving on the twenty-second for Swaby's ranch. One night will be spent at Swaby's, and then to Kaneohe.

Mesqui Village.
October 24 the men will arrive in Waimanalo, the city of mosquitoes. Two nights will be spent there, and this will mean two nights of real hard fighting—not the real fighting that soldiers are trained for, but fighting mosquitoes. Owing to the fact that it is impossible for wagons to proceed around the point in Koko Head direction, they will return to the post from Waimanalo over the Paik, and the men will be supplied with haversack rations, enough to carry them back to the post. The battalion will move on to Lucas' ranch on the twenty-sixth, and on the twenty-seventh will return to Fort Shafter. The men are looking forward to this as the greatest hike since the second battalion of the Twentieth Infantry arrived on the island.

General Fatigue.
In order to leave the post in the best possible condition on the three weeks' march, general fatigue has been in vogue since last Tuesday. The post is being put in fine condition, under the direction of Quartermaster-Lieutenant J. A. Rogers, for it can be imagined what about seventy-five men can do in one day when they are set to work.

Rowe in Hospital.
Corporal Barton C. Rowe of Company G has been admitted to the post hospital. Rowe has had a bad cold for some weeks past, and before it could develop into a fever of some sort it was thought best by the doctors to have him in the hospital, where constant attention could be given. Rowe will no doubt miss the long hike, but it is to be hoped that nothing serious will happen to him.

Corrathers Made Corporal.
Private Leslie Y. Corrathers of Company E has been appointed corporal to fill a vacancy. Corrathers transferred some months ago from the hospital corps of the post to Company E, and it was rumored at the time that Corrathers wanted experience and information in the line so that some time in the future he could take the examination for a commission. The "corps" man has been faithful in his duties in the company and has earned his appointment.

Okrey in Hospital.
Barney Okrey of Company F reported Wednesday morning at the hospital with a high fever and was immediately placed under the doctor's care. For some weeks Okrey has been working in the quartermaster's department on special duty. Okrey was excused from the hike on account of his work, but as matters stand now he will probably spend the entire three weeks as a patient in the hospital.

Lancaster to Bakers' School.
Private Howard M. Lancaster of Company G has been selected as a candidate for the Training School for Bakers and Cooks, Presidio of San Francisco, Cal., and will leave on the October transport. Private Lancaster has been a valuable man to his company. For some months

past Lancaster has been captain of the company lawn and has kept them in fine condition, causing many words of praise from the officers regarding the good appearance of things around Company G. He will return to Fort Shafter in four months. The men of the post wish him success while in the States.

Medical Attention on Hike.
Lieutenant Wm. H. Smith of the Hospital Corps will attend the troops while away on the twenty-one day practice march. The lieutenant will take with him First Class Private Melton of his corps, to assist him. The doctor has a fine horse and is making arrangements to ride him on the hike. The doctor is one of the essentials on a hike of this kind, and the men keep him busy with sore feet and legs.

"PUTTEE" STRONG HAPPY.
Former Husband of May Yohe Is Reconciled With Family.
BERLIN, Sept. 25.—The American friends of Putnam Bradley Strong of New York, erstwhile husband of May Yohe, will be surprised to learn that he has become thoroughly reconciled with his family, particularly his mother, from whom the Yohe affair so long estranged him.

Strong passed through Germany this week with his mother on the way from Marienbad, where they had been spending several weeks. He has grown stout, but is still handsome and appeared in excellent spirits. The Strongs were bound for London.
