**DR. CRIPPEN IS CAUGHT**

FATHERPOINT, Quebec, July 31.—Dr. Hawley Crippen, the American dentist who is accused of the murder of his wife, Belle Elmore, the actress, was arrested here today in company with Clara Leneve, his stenographer, with whom he fled. The couple were taken in charge on the Canadian steamship Montrose when the vessel reached port. Detective Dew of Scotland Yard identified both the man and the woman.

Dr. Crippen took his arrest coolly, but the girl collapsed. No effort has yet been made to extract a confession from either of them. Jewels on Dr. Crippen are the only incriminating evidence found.

Both Crippen and Miss Leneve were in ignorance of the fact that their identity had been discovered by wireless, although Crippen exhibited considerable nervousness when he looked over the side of the vessel and saw detectives disguised as pilots on the pilot boat.

The detectives of Scotland Yard suspected that Crippen and his stenographer had fled to America on the Montrose, and while the vessel was still several days out at sea, the wireless was brought into use and inquiry of the captain of the vessel elicited the information that the man and woman who were wanted by the police were aboard.

Coming ashore in the boat the prisoners were separated and closely guarded to prevent either one committing suicide. They will probably be taken to England next Thursday, either being deported or extradited.

Dr. Hawley Crippen is believed to have killed his wife last February and buried her body in quicklime in the cellar of his house. The body was discovered about two weeks ago, although Belle Elmore had been missing since February.

Suspicion at once pointed to Dr. Crippen as the murderer. It was known that he was enamored of his stenographer, Clara Leneve, and when the couple fled, the detectives were virtually sure of their guilt. Miss Leneve will probably be charged with having had some part in the grisly crime.

**INSANE MOTHER DROWNS CHILDREN**  
 ANTIOCH, Cal., July 31.—A mother yesterday drowned four of her younger children in a bathtub and attempted to kill her two elder children in the same manner. The two made their escape, their screams attracting the attention of Sheriff Veale, who was passing the farmhouse. The woman is evidently insane.

**EX-SECRETARY CARLISLE DEAD.**  
 NEW YORK, July 31.—John Griffin Carlisle, who was Secretary of the Treasury under President Cleveland, died here of heart failure today. His death was not unexpected, as he had been seriously ill for some time.

Carlisle was for many years prominent in the public affairs of the United States, and was one of the influential members of the Democratic party. He was a member of Congress from the Forty-fifth to the Fifty-first Congress. He was Speaker of the House three terms. In 1890 he resigned from the House to become United States Senator to fill the unexpired term of James B. Beck, who had died.

After his retirement from office he devoted himself to practicing law in New York.

 WASHINGTON, D. C., July 31.—The government has decided to make an official investigation into the cause of infantile paralysis, which is prevalent throughout the country and which has claimed thousands of children as victims.

**SPAIN AWAITS DEVELOPMENTS**  
 ROME, July 31.—The situation in regard to the rupture between the Spanish Government and the Vatican remains unchanged as yet. The papal nuncio at Madrid has not been recalled, though it is thought that the Vatican only awaits the official recall by Spain of De Ojeda, ambassador to the Vatican, before taking similar action.
