LORIMER QUILTS CLUB  
(Associated Press Cable.)  
CHICAGO, Sept. 11.—United States Senator Lorimer has tendered his resignation as a member of the Hamilton Club of this city.

There is a prospect of a fight in the club over the acceptance of his resignation.  
Lorimer, who had been invited to a banquet given in honor of Colonel Roosevelt, was later notified that his invitation had been withdrawn on account of the ex-President refusing to attend the banquet if Lorimer was present.  
The banquet was given and Roosevelt was made much of. The colonel's address of the evening was a denunciation of graft in this State. Lorimer, whose presence was not desired, was charged with last year having secured his office by bribing members of the Illinois Legislature. Roosevelt, when invited to the banquet in his honor on Thursday, declared that he would not be present at any function attended by Lorimer.  
Lorimer's resignation has created a great deal of disagreement among the Hamilton's members, many of whom insist that his resignation should not be accepted.

ROOSEVELT AND POLITICS

NEW YORK, Sept. 11.—Colonel Roosevelt's return home from his Western trip has promptly started a fight for the control of the delegates to the New York Republican State convention. The result of the contest will depend largely upon the primaries that are to be held tomorrow at Buffalo.

Colonel Roosevelt's attempt to dominate New York State Republican politics met with defeat a short time ago, but he has not yet given up the fight. He plunged into it again as soon as he reached home, and the prospects are that events will be exciting from now on.

END OF EUCHARIST CONGRESS.

MONTREAL, Sept. 11.—A splendid pageant ended the Eucharist congress in this city today. The parade was four miles long and was viewed by no less than half a million people. Cardinal Vanuetti marched with the host, and as it passed, the throngs knelt reverently. Two hundred thousand people, unable to obtain better accommodations, slept in the parks Saturday night. The next eucharistic congress will be held in Vienna.

STOLE GOLD, LEFT LEAD.

SEATTLE, Sept. 11.—Gold bullion to the value of \$57,500, comprising a part of the Alaska shipment to the Horton Dexter Bank of Seattle, was stolen on shipboard between Alaska and this city. The thieves who made the big haul substituted lead for the gold, and consequently the theft was not discovered until the criminals had had time to make their escape with the bullion. There is no clue as to the identity of the thieves.
